

Gielgud Readings

Tickets Available For Artists Series

Distribution of student tickets for the performance of Sir John Gielgud, famed Shakespearean actor, will begin at 1 p.m. today at the Hetzel Union desk.

Students may obtain tickets by presenting matriculation cards. Distribution will continue through Saturday unless the available tickets are taken before that time.

The sale of tickets to non-students will begin at 9 a.m. tomorrow and continue through Friday. Non-student tickets are \$1.25 each.

Gielgud is scheduled to appear at 8:30 p.m. Saturday in Schwab Auditorium. He will present a program of solo readings entitled "Shakespeare's Ages of Man." The readings will include selections from most of Shakespeare's most famous plays.

Gielgud was born in London in 1904. He was educated at Westminster School and studied for the stage at Lady Benson's School and the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art. He was a scholarship student at both schools.

He made his first appearance on the stage at London's famed Old Vic Theatre in 1921 as a herald in "Henry V." This was followed by appearances in such plays as "The Insect Play," "Robert E. Lee," "Charley's Aunt" and "Romeo and Juliet" in which he played Romeo.

Since that time he has appeared in many Shakespearean plays and plays by Britain's top authors. He last appeared in the United States in Christopher Fry's "The Lady's Not For Burning." He also appeared here in "Hamlet," "The Importance of Being Earnest," "Love for Love" and "Crime and Punishment."

He is probably best known by the American audience for his portrayal of Cassius in the movie "Julius Caesar."

Arnold Named To New Post

Christian K. Arnold, associate professor of engineering research, has been named associate professor of journalism.

He will continue as staff assistant to President Eric A. Walker.

Arnold is a graduate of the University of Colorado where he received his bachelor of arts degree in English literature and also qualified for a master of arts degree in English literature and a master of education degree in administration.

Before his appointment to the University faculty in 1953, he held positions as technical editor of the U.S. Civil Engineering Research and Development Laboratory at Port Hueneme, Calif.; instructor in English at the University of Colorado; and as teacher of journalism and English in the La Junta, Colo., public schools.

Mason to Speak At HUB Tonight
