

No Student Tickets Remain for Reading

It took only four hours yesterday for all 850 student tickets to the John Gielgud Shakespearian reading to be grabbed up.

The reading will be at 8:30 p.m. Saturday in Schwab Auditorium.

Almost 500 of the tickets were given out in the first half-hour—1 to 1:30 p.m.

Approximately 300 non-student tickets will go on sale at 9 a.m. today at the Hetzel Union desk. They are \$1.25.

For his performance Gielgud has selected a group of readings he calls "Shakespeare's Ages of Man." The program is divided into three parts—youth, manhood and old age.

The section titled "Youth" will include readings designed to portray childhood, magic, nature, sport, love, jealousy and lust. "Manhood" will include readings portraying war, civil strife, kingship, government and society, passion and character "Old Age" will include selections about death, sickness, man against himself, old age and time.

Gielgud's tentative program includes selections from:

The Passionate Pilgrim, "Cymbeline," "Hamlet," "Sonnet 11," "Midsummer Night's Dream," "The Tempest," "Romeo and Juliet," "Twelfth Night," "Merchant of Venice," "Much Ado About Nothing," "Love's Labour Lost,"

"Sonnet 18," "Sonnet 116", "Sonnet 130"

"Troilus and Cressida," "The Winter's Tale," "Sonnet 129," "Measure for Measure," "Henry V," "Henry IV," "Richard II," "Julius Caesar," "Sonnets to Sundry," "Sonnet 73," "Sonnet 30," "Richard III," "Sonnet 29," "King Lear," "Sonnet 138," "Henry VIII."

During the course of his career in the theatre, Gielgud has performed in almost every one of the plays he will read during the performance. He has played Hamlet in three different productions of the play. He has played King Richard in "Richard II." Among his many other roles have been Romeo, Mercutio, Shylock, King Lear, Macbeth, Cassius and Prospero.

funds should go toward a more effective system of college scholarships and loans, he said. Illustrating this, he reported that the average loan to a college student is \$20 and the loan to the average family for such things as television sets is \$2000.

Commenting on the international situation, Clark said: "If there's a need in the world today that I feel isn't being met, it's the search for peace."

Clark called for a complete re-vamping of foreign policy to establish a long range plan. Citing examples of Quemoy and the Middle East, he stressed that some definite policy must evolve, and it must come from the executive level.

"We are dealing with individuals in the Kremlin who are the Jimmy Hoffa's of Russia," he said.

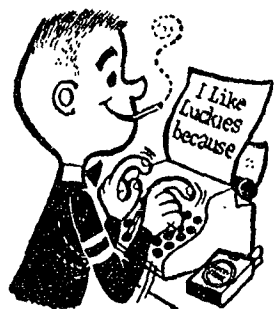
"But we must find some way of bringing about the peace and good will we like to talk about so often," he added.

Androcles, junior men's hat society, will meet at 6:15 tonight in the Hetzel Union parking lot to prepare for the motorcade and pep rally.

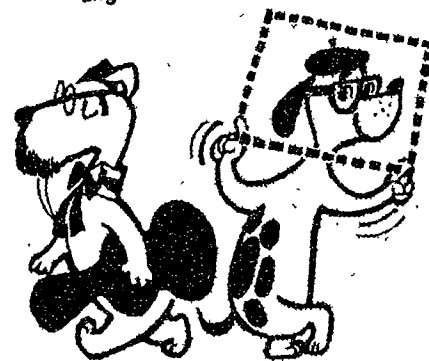

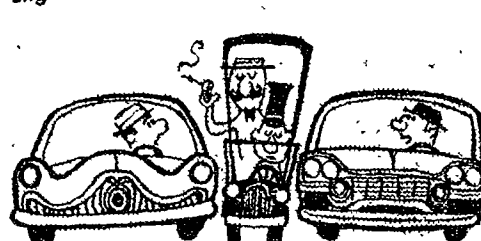

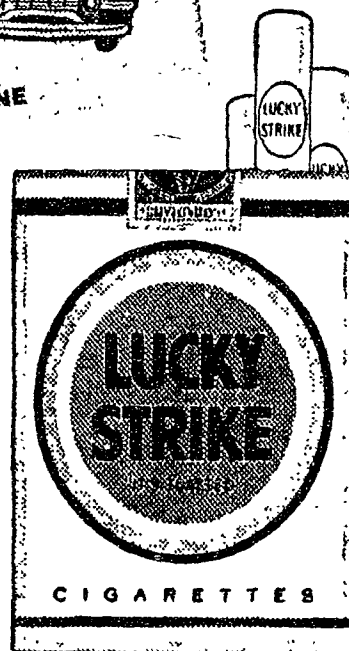
