

Tickets for Ballet Are Available Today

The distribution of student tickets for the Roberto Iglesias Ballet Espanol will begin at 1 p.m. today and continue through Sunday or until the supply is exhausted.

Students may obtain tickets by presenting matriculation cards at the Hetzel Union desk.

The sale of tickets to non-students will begin at 9 a.m. tomorrow. The price of tickets is \$1.25.

The appearance of Iglesias and his ballet company is scheduled for 8 p.m. Sunday in Recreation Hall. His performance here will be one of the first on a 50-city tour that will take him through the United States and Canada.

Iglesias formed his company two years ago, hand-picking his 20 dancers from among the best Spanish dancers in the field today.

Iglesias and his company appeared at Carnegie Hall last year following a tour of South America. Iglesias rented the hall himself with borrowed funds and staked the reputation of his company as well as his own on that appearance. Carnegie Hall was sold out before the performance, and the company received rave notices.

In addition to the traditional dances, the group performs dances which Iglesias himself has arranged. His own choreography is usually based on the

folklore of the many provinces of Spain and the Spanish islands.

Among the members of his company are the noted Spanish dancer Rosario Galen, who heads the feminine part of the group, and guest artists Rosario Escudero and Ana Mercedes. Two famed Spanish vocalists, Maria Fabregas, mezzo-soprano, and Pepe Segunda, Flamenco singer, also appear.

The appearance of the Ballet Espanol marks the fourth of the present Artists Series programs.

Material and supplies—\$25.

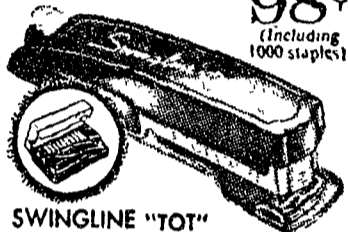
Orientation week—\$25.
