

Off-Campus Living Rises 12 Per Cent

A Department of Housing survey issued yesterday shows that 45.4 per cent of the University's men students live in private off-campus or trailer housing.

The figure is a 12.4 per cent increase over last year's totals, Otto E. Mueller, director of the department, said. A total of 4417 men live in private off-campus housing and 398 live in trailers.

The University's 55 fraternities house 19.8 per cent of the men students, a total of 2089. This percentage does not include 159 students who are affiliated with fraternities but who do not live in the houses.

A breakdown by classes, finds 709 junior men, 676 seniors, 612 sophomores, and 42 freshmen living in the fraternity houses. The number of men students living at home dropped from 19 per cent last year to 8.9 per cent this fall, Mueller said. The num-

ber of women living at home is 9.4 per cent or 377 students.

Last year 38 per cent—2803—of the men students lived in the residence halls but the percentage has dropped to 26.3 per cent for the fall semester. Eighty-one per cent—3237—of the women students live in residence halls, the survey reveals.

The number of women students living in private off-campus housing numbers 344, or 8.8 per cent of the women's housing figures. Only 30 women, .8 per cent, live in trailers compared to the 396 men.

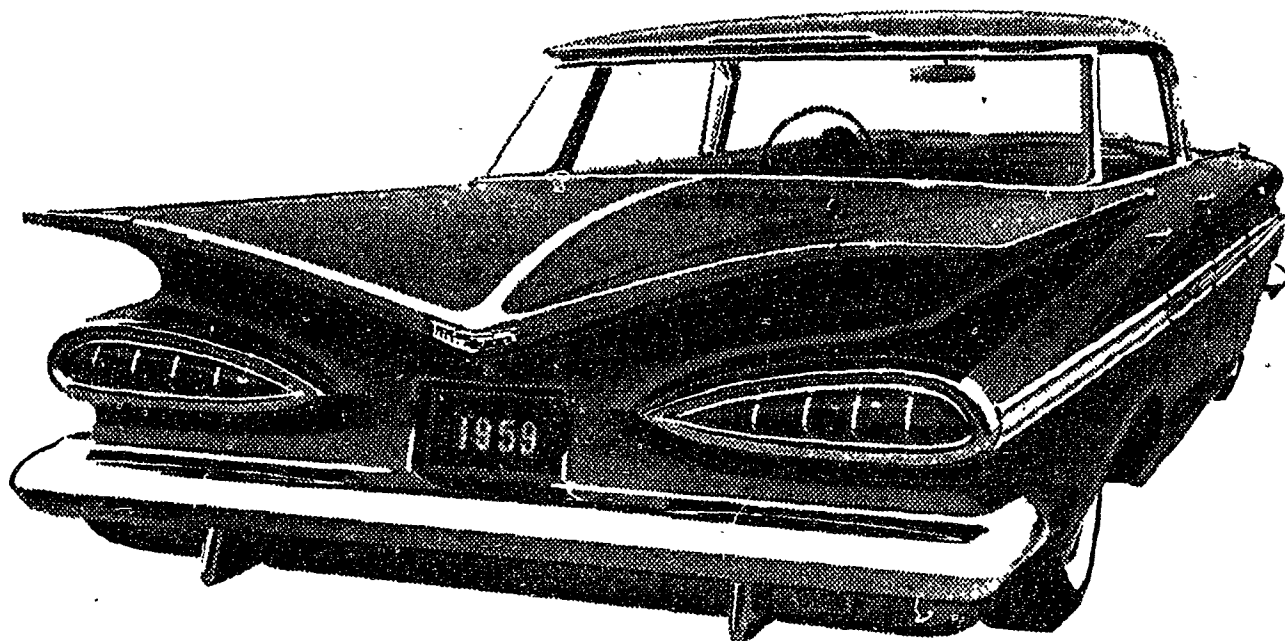
