May I only give full credit for fine performance to Maita Harrison, greatly underrated as Mrs. Moppy, as well as Mary Minkewich, Ivan Ladizinsky and Leonard Tarnowski, who is not only "marvelously funny" but a marvelous actor. Credit could be subtracted from Mr. Ladizinsky's performance, but it's not his fault he frequently looked awkward and confused—he suffered from confused direction in his stand-about, "What am I going to do now" role.

Unconvincing were Patricia Thompson who acted as if she were "stage struck" by Susan Strasberg, and Ellis Grove who admirably projects but can't act

the sportswriters and sportscasters participating in the poll are, in order, Mississippi, Oklahoma, Wisconsin, Colorado and Purdue. Louisiana State accumulated 54 first-place votes in piling up 1194 points.

The second-place Iowans, who handed Wisconsin its first defeat and last Saturday put the first blot on Northwestern's record, were the No. 1 choice of 33 voters and their point total added up to 1055.

Army still was the top choice of 20 voters and received a total of 989 points.

Three new teams reached the top 10 this week replacing Texas, No. 4 a week ago, Clemson, No. 10 and Northwestern, No. 8. The Longhorns were upset by Rice, 34-7, and Clemson took a 26-6 pasting from South Carolina.

The newcomers in the top 10 are unbeaten Colorado, which jumped from 12th to 9th by beating Nebraska; Purdue, climbing from 15th to 10th after defeating Notre Dame, and Wisconsin, moving up from 13th to 8th on the basis of its tie with Ohio State

In the second 10 are Northwestern, Pittsburgh, Air Force, Rice, Navy, Texas, North Carolina, Texas Christian, Clemson and Rutgers.
