

'Wide-Open' Offenses Making Low Marks in College Football

NEW YORK (AP) — Despite more emphasis on opening up the game—lonely ends, slot-T and winged-T formations—offense statistics are the lowest in years in major college football.

NCAA Service Bureau figures released Tuesday show Army has again regained the total offense lead, averaging 408.3 yards a game—lower than any winning average since Duke's 372.2 in 1941.

Colorado, although held to 87 yards by Oklahoma last weekend, retained the rushing lead with a 303.8-yard average, well below the winning average for any season since Army took the title with 298.6 in 1944.

While Colorado skidded from first to fourth in total offense, the Buffs retained a pretty fair edge in rushing offense. Brigham

Young is second (274.4) and Penn State (260.0) third.

San Jose State, the new passing leader, with a 174.3-yard average, has a mark lower than any winning average since 1947, when Michigan was tops with 173.9. And Rutgers' 35-point average that leads the scoring statistics is less than any leader has had since Texas was champ with 33.8 in 1941.

Only in field goals have this year's figures been on the upgrade. Some 71 field goals have been kicked thus far—seven more than were kicked all last season and within 11 of the modern record (82) set in 1952. Kansas State leads with five.

This is the third time in five weeks that Army has led in total offense. The Cadets, a leader each alternate week, took over again while running up 68 points against

Colgate, the top one-game scoring show of the year. That pushed Army from seventh to second in scoring with a 33.7 average.

Iowa, with 384.0 yards a game, and Air Force, with 374.8, are right behind Army in total offense.

San Jose State jumped from 15th to first in passing yardage in two weeks, collecting 491 against Denver and Idaho.

Hardin-Simmons, last week's leader, dropped to fourth behind Army and Navy, but still has been the most air-minded team in the nation—attempting 216 and completing 104. Alabama is at the other end of the scale, throwing only 30 in six games.

Washington State leads in completions with a .613 percentage and also in TD passes with 13.
