Any sustained drive that the Inebriates managed to start was repulsed by six Phi Kappa Sig's interceptions. Also the Inebriates killed their own cause with penalties totaling 95 yards.

Bob Brown, a 9.5 dashman, was a standout on defense for the Inebriates, throwing Bonar for several losses. Dick Hambright kept the PKS's from further scoring with two key interceptions.

Tonight's game culminated the most successful year in the history of IM football. A total of 102 teams participated in 239 contests, giving the IM its most active season.
