

# University Livestock Take Championships

Nineteen championships were awarded to University animals at the Pennsylvania Livestock Exposition in Harrisburg last week.

Five of the University entries were grand champions and two were reserve grand champions.

Grand and reserve grand championships awarded to University beef cattle were:

Grand champion Shorthorn bull; grand champion Polled Hereford female; grand champion steer of the show; grand champion group of three steers; reserve grand champion bull of the Angus show and reserve grand champion female of the Angus show.

The grand champion lamb, a Hampshire wether, was shown by University shepherd, Carroll Shaffner.

University animals were also awarded eight championships and five reserve championships.

They were: Champion Shorthorn steer; champion pen of three Shorthorn steers; champion pen of three Angus steers; champion female of Polled Hereford; champion pen of three Hereford steers; champion Southdown ram; champion Southdown ewe

and champion Hampshire wether lamb.

Reserve champion Shorthorn steer; reserve junior champion Angus bull; reserve junior champion Angus female; reserve champion Hereford steer and reserve champion pen of three Herefords.

The animals shown in Harrisburg are at the Eastern National Livestock Exposition in Timonium, Md., this week.

Animals shown in these exhibitions are expected to appear in the 59th International Live Stock Exposition and Horse Show at the Chicago Stock Yards Nov. 28 through Dec. 6.

The women's debate squad failed to place in their first tournament of the year at St. Joseph's College in Philadelphia.

In the men's tournament, Leonard Julius, junior in journalism from West Palm Beach, Fla., won a fourth place speaker rating. Marshall Jacobson and Arthur Ichter of the affirmative team defeated Buffalo Teachers College and the Rochester Institute of Technology. However, they lost to Fordham University and Dartmouth and Oberlin Colleges.

Alan Elms and Leonard Julius of the negative team defeated the Dartmouth, Oberlin, Rochester Institute of Technology and St. John's College of Jamaica teams. They lost to the team of the United States Military Academy.

The four members of the women's debate squad were Patricia Bilonick and Vicki O'Donnell of the affirmative team and Ellen

Donovan and Marjorie Ganter of the negative team.
