

# Vogt, Palaschak Win IM Bouts; Semi-Finals Will Start Today

The quarter-final round of the intramural boxing tournament was completed last night with three split decisions, three stopped bouts, and only one unanimous vote determining the winners in seven matches.

Four independent and three fraternity pugilists gained berths in the semi-finals which will be run off tonight and Monday at 5 p.m. in Rec Hall.

Independent Ben Bow registered the only unanimous decision in the first bout of the evening in the 135-pound class. Bow used a right cross and good combinations to outpoint Ed Heary in a slow, deliberate opener.

The pace picked up as indies Mark Silverstein and Mike Kocur stepped into the ring and squared off in a 128-pound pairing that might best be described as a good mixer. All three rounds saw a good exchange of blows from the gloves of both contestants and Silverstein was declared victor in a split decision.

Two other independent fights failed to go the distance as Christian Vogt stopped Frank Lobb in a 165-pound bout and heavyweight Bob Sutherland won over

Dick Miller in a blood-spattered fracas.

Miller, who was ahead on points when the fight was halted, caught a square shot on the nose midway through the second round. When Sutherland landed another blow on Miller's red nose in the third round referee Frank Patrick stepped in.

Alpha Chi Rho picked up two split-decision wins in the fraternity division as 145-pound Gerald

well and had trouble scoring against the other. Ziegler gained the nod.

Theta Kappa Phi's Dick Palaschak, whom Sulkowski, Penn State's last boxing coach, describes as "tall and rangy, possessing a good punch" stopped Walter McDanel of Alpha Gamma Rho in the second round in a 145-pound thriller.

Tom Gross, Sigma Nu, forfeited to Richard Hinkel, Alpha Sigma Phi, in the fraternity 155-pound class and independent Gary Fry advanced in the heavyweight category when Sam Burrows was declared ineligible because of previous participation in Golden Gloves tournaments.
