The new basketball rule deals with the charging rule. Last year the defensive player wasn't permitted to establish position in the path of the dribbler so quickly that the dribbler could not change his course of direction. This year the defensive player may.

The dribbler must now avoid contact by changing direction or ending his dribble if an opponent is able to establish legally a "face to face" defensive position in his path.

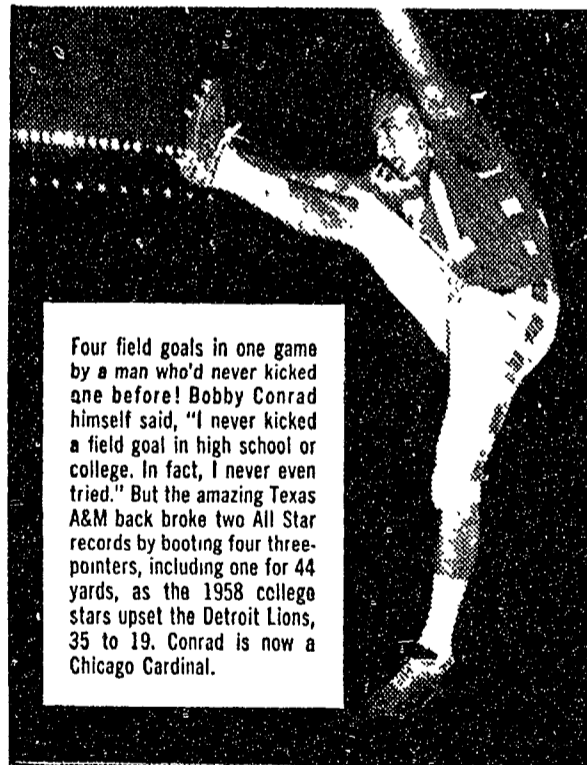
