It is an undisputed fact that our courts are occasionally in error. And this is a most powerful reason for ending death sentences. No one knows how many innocent men have heard juries return the verdict of "quilty of murder in the first degree."

Sometimes the wrong is brought to light and the man's name is cleared. But if he already has been put to death, it's just a little late for the court to erase its mistake.
As long as the death penalty

exists, innocent men as well as the guilty and insane will continue to be murdered by the courts.
