

# Lion Cagers Wallop Fading Owls, 70-36

Temple University's basketball team "ain't what it used to be just a few years ago." The once mighty Owls who were among the top 10 teams in the nation for the last three years hit rock bottom last night as they were smothered by a hustling Penn State five, 70-36.

The Owls who usually have a fast breaking, and deadly shooting team hit on only 21 per cent of their shots while the Lions, led by Mark "the Magician" DuMars, hit on 49 per cent of their attempts.

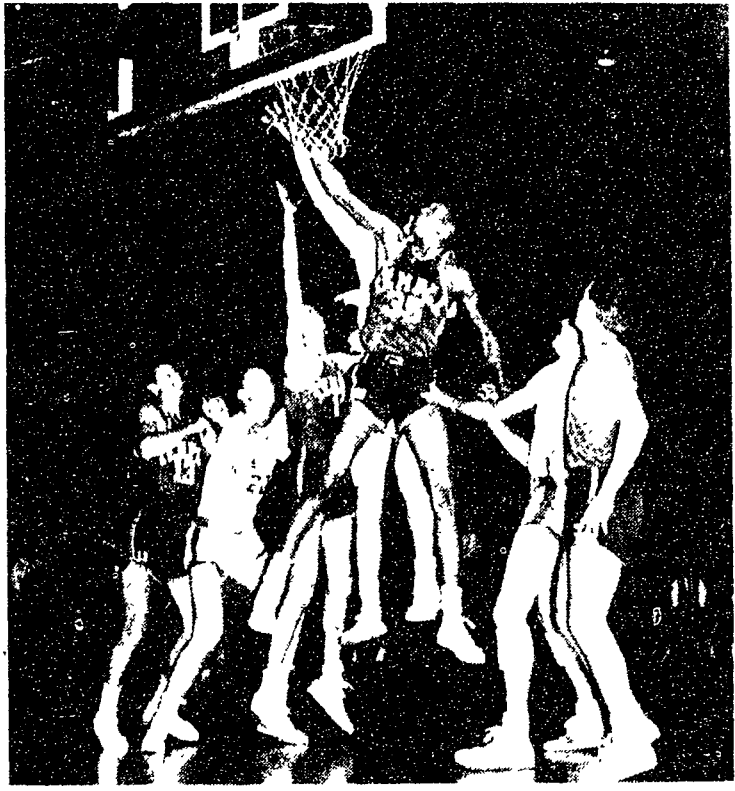
The personal battle that was expected between Temple's All-East star "Pickles" Kennedy and DuMars never materialized as DuMars stole the show from the Owl star.

DuMars scored 21 points while Kennedy only had eight. The only place where Kennedy looked half like an all-East performer was in the playmaking department, but he finished a distant second to DuMars.

The Magician rifled seven beautiful assists through the Temple defense which had the crowd buzzing its approval.

Bob Edwards, who finished the night with 17 points, was the target on most of DuMars' passes as Penn State unleashed a fast break which caught the Owls' defense napping.

Temple was in the game for only a short time and that was
