

Gymnastic Squad Sets For EIGL Title Match

Gymnastic coach Gene Wettstone has a big problem for Saturday afternoon's meet with Army, the defending Eastern champions. But Wettstone isn't crying at all.

Quite to the contrary, his "problem" is a delightful one—where to use all the top performers that comprise one of the strongest gym teams the Lions have ever had (and that includes past teams that have won eight Eastern and four national titles).

To add to his "plight," Vince "the Marlboro Kid" Neuhauser was declared eligible for competition yesterday. Neuhauser joins three other Lion stars who became eligible this semester—Captain Armando Vega, Graeme Cowan and Lee Cunningham.

Without Neuhauser, the Lion rope trio was probably the best in the East as it swept the first three spots in both January wins. The addition of Neuhauser eliminates the "probably." The only trio in the East (and possibly the nation) that could beat them is from Army. They will decide that honor Saturday.

Neuhauser consistently broke

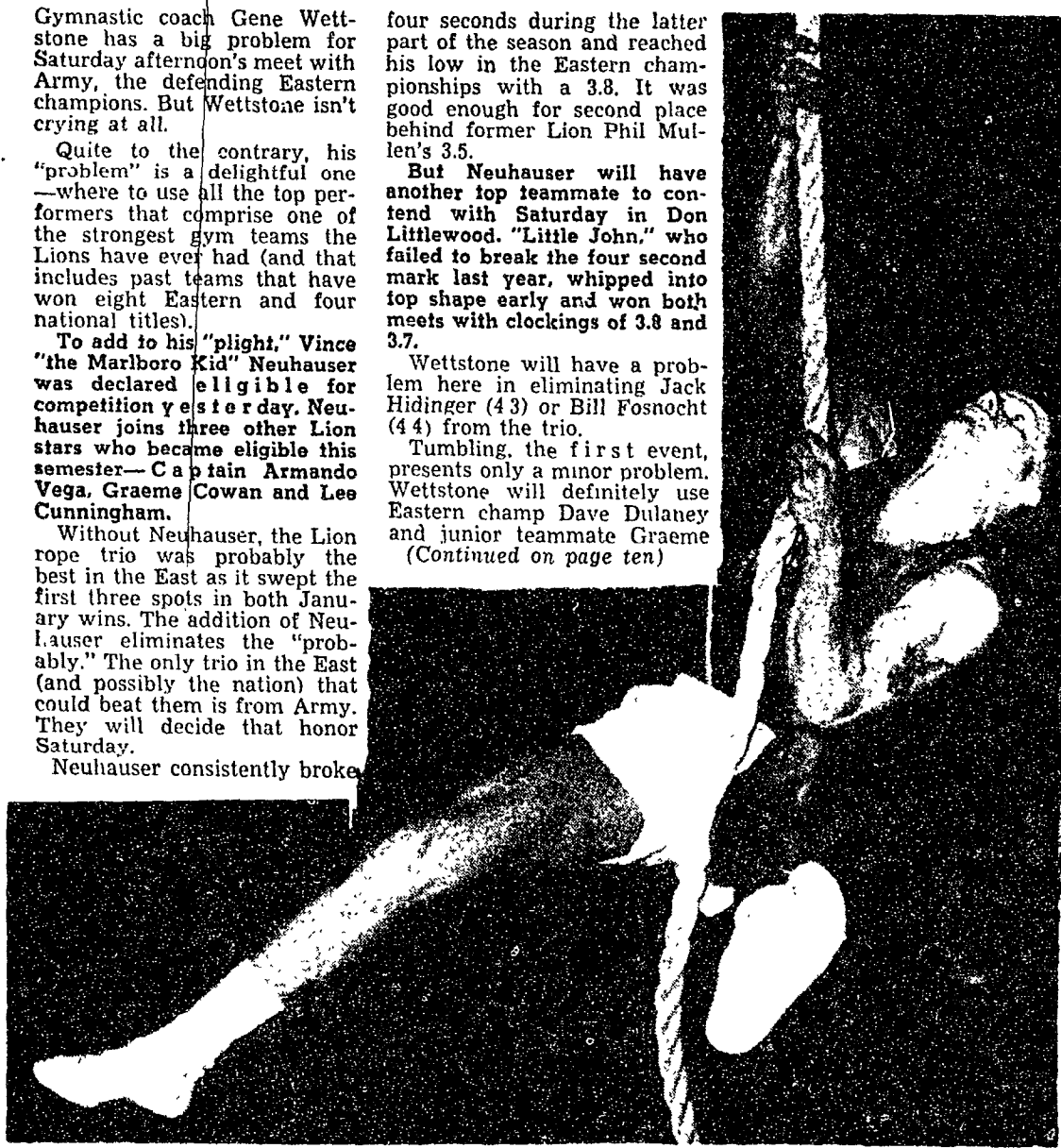
four seconds during the latter part of the season and reached his low in the Eastern championships with a 3.8. It was good enough for second place behind former Lion Phil Mullen's 3.5.

But Neuhauser will have another top teammate to contend with Saturday in Don Littlewood. "Little John," who failed to break the four second mark last year, whipped into top shape early and won both meets with clockings of 3.8 and 3.7.

Wettstone will have a problem here in eliminating Jack Hiding (43) or Bill Fosnocht (44) from the trio.

Tumbling, the first event, presents only a minor problem. Wettstone will definitely use Eastern champ Dave Dulaney and junior teammate Graeme

New TV Football Plan Considered by NCAA

CHICAGO (AP)—The NCAA's TV Committee Wednesday completed hearings on a 1959 program for college football and indicated the plan may be completed Thursday.

Asa Bushnell, the committee's TV program director, said it was possible the ratio of national and regional telecasts may be changed. For the past two years, the NCAA program provided for nine national game-of-the-week telecasts and four dates for regional

telecasts within the eight NCAA districts.

The 12-member committee may consider 8 national and 5 regional dates or 10 national and 3 regional telecasts, Bushnell said. Previously, the NCAA program allowed a school one national and one regional, or two regional appearances.

Howard Grubbs of the Southwest Conference, elected chairman of the 1959 TV committee, said the NCAA membership must approve the plan in a mail referendum. Approval requires a two-thirds majority of those voting.

Pi Kappa Phi Retains Lead In League 'A'

Pi Kappa Phi forged right along in its domination of fraternity bowling league "A" by chalking up a 4-0 victory against Theta Kappa Phi in its first game of this semester's pin action.

Pi Kappa Phi had previously won the league "A" title last semester with a 40-3 won-lost record.

Phi Delta Theta rolled to a tie with Sigma Alpha Epsilon but managed to pick up the individual laurels on the way. John Blanck copped the high single with a 211 and the high series with 558. Phi Delta Theta also grabbed the high game with 734.

Fred Taylor rolled the high single of the night with a 221 in leading Delta Tau Delta to a 4-0 win over Phi Kappa Psi.

Phi Kappa chalked up the high game of 789 for the night by whitewashing Alpha Rho Chi 4-0. Don Block with a 199 single and Marv Block with a 500 series aided Alpha Epsilon Pi in its 3-1 victory over Phi Epsilon Pi. Theta Chi and Phi Mu Delta tied.


