

# 618 Tickets Remain For Artists Series

Six hundred and eighteen tickets remain to be distributed for the Concordia Choir performance to be given at 8:30 p.m. Monday in Schwab Auditorium.

Yesterday 518 student tickets were distributed. Of the 618 tickets remaining 200 to 300 are being reserved for sale to non-students at \$1.25 each. Sales to non-students begin today.

The Concordia Choir, the ninth feature of the Artists Series, is from Concordia College, Moorhead, Minn., and is directed by Paul J. Christiansen.

Christiansen is the son of the composer F. Melius Christiansen, a native of Norway, who became famous for his St. Olaf Choir of Northfield, Minn. Several of the compositions of the elder Christiansen will be included on the program Monday night.

The Concordia Choir under Christiansen won international prestige as a result of a 2-month tour of Europe during the summer of 1958. The majority of the 66-voice group is of Scandinavian heritage and so the trip to Norway was a return to the homeland of their forefathers.

At their first concert in Oslo, Norway's Crown Prince Olaf and Crown Princess Martha were honored guests.

From Oslo the choir travelled around the southern coast and north along the western coast to Trondheim, stopping at all principal cities. Their concerts drew capacity audiences everywhere.

Their performance Monday night will include Shaw's "Sing We Merrily Unto God Our Strength," Bach's "The Spirit Also Hoareth Us," Praetorius' "Today Is Born Emmanuel," Schuman's "Three Canonic Choruses," Christiansen's "Great Is the Holy One of Israel," Brahms' "Liebeslieder Walzer, Opus 52," Berger's "In a Time of Pestilence," Kodaly's "A Christmas Carol," and Nicolai's "Wake, Awake."

# Tape Proves Soviets Gunned U.S. Plane --

 "The tail assembly is falling off the target . . ."  
 "Look at him, he will not get away, he is already falling."  
 "Yes, he is falling, I will finish him off, boys, I will finish him off on the run."  
 "The target has lost control, it is going down."  
 "Now the target will fall . . ."  
 "The target has turned over . . ."  
 "The target is falling."  
 On the way home, one of the

Russian voices bragged: "After my third pass the target started burning."  
 State Department officials refused to say how they came into possession of the recording. Press officer Lincoln White called it absolutely authentic as an account of the assault.  
 Department officials said they did not intend to give up in their efforts to find out what happened to the other 11 of the 17 believed to have been aboard the plane.

The remains of six were delivered by Soviet authorities to U.S. authorities on the Soviet-Turkish border Sept. 24.  
 Four of the bodies could be identified and they were turned over to relatives last fall.  
 Two, unidentified, are to be given burial with military honors Friday in Arlington National Cemetery. The timing of their funeral was given as one of the reasons for the release of the tape recording.

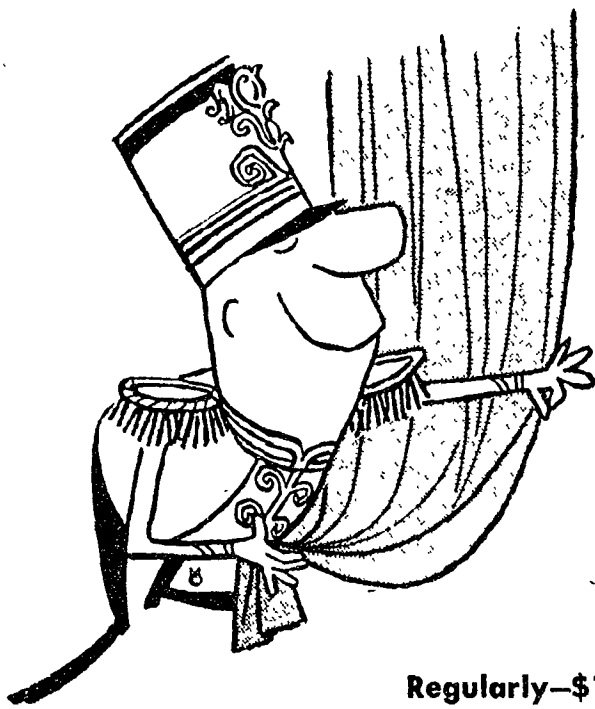
