The Concordia Choir, the ninth feature of the Artists Series, is from Concordia College, Moorhead, Minn., and is directed by Paul J. Christiansen.

Christiansen is the son of the composer F. Melius Christiansen, a native of Norway, who became famous for his St. Olaf Choir of Northfield, Minn. Several of the compositions of the elder Chris-tiansen will be included on the program Monday night.

The Concordia Choir under Christiansen won international prestige as a result of a 2-month tour of Europe during the summer of 1958.
