

Stuttgart Concert Tickets Available

Tickets for the Stuttgart Chamber Orchestra Concert at 8:30 p.m. Friday will be available to students at 1 p.m. today at the Hetzel Union desk.

Karl Muenchinger will conduct the orchestra.

He founded the orchestra in Stuttgart in the fall of 1945. It consists of five first violins, four second violins, four violas, three cellos and one bass viol.

The repertoire of the orchestra includes compositions ranging from early Baroque music to Mozart and the Viennese classics and includes modern works by Hindemith, Honegger, Barber, Britten, Walton, Stravinsky and Rousset.

The group has performed throughout Western Europe, Switzerland, France, England, Italy, Spain and other countries and have appeared at the Salzburg and Edinburgh Festivals.

During the 1953-54 season, the orchestra made its first North

American tour, including on the itinerary a concert at the University on March 22, 1954.

Tickets for the performance Friday will be available every day from 9 a.m. to 12 noon and 1 until 5 p.m. through Friday. Ticket sales to non-students begin at 9 a.m. tomorrow at \$1.25 each.

Campaign Funds Discussed

Should All-University Elections Committee limit campaign funds for political parties?

The committee said "no" with an 11 to 9 straw vote Sunday night, but a definite decision must be made at a meeting next Sunday.

It did, however, reject by a 19 to 1 vote a Student Encampment recommendation that All-University Cabinet allocate party campaign funds. Some committee members felt the Cabinet allocation would destroy individual initiative.

On the pro side, it was felt that

the allocation would allow students without the money to contribute to campaign funds, to run for office.

According to a letter read at the committee meeting from William F. Fuller, manager of the Associated Student Activities Fund office, Campus party owes \$56.25 to The Daily Collegian for the spring of 1958 and \$21.51 to Keeler's for the fall of 1957.

It was suggested that bills be sent to the parties before elections when they are still responsible for paying them.
