# Chapel Talk To Be Given By Proctor

Dr. Samuel De Witt Proctor, president of the Virginia Union University, will speak on "Safe for Free People" at the University Chapel service of worship at 10:55 a.m. tomorrow in Schwab Auditorium.

The Chapel Choir, directed by Willa Taylor, will sing as introtit, a German traditional melody, "Jesu, Meine Freude" (Jesu, Priceless Treasure) as adapted and harmonized by Johann Cruger. The choir will sing Virgil Thomson's arrangement of Psalm 130, "De Profundis" as the anthem.

George E. Ceiga, University organist, will play as the prelude, "The Cross, Our True and Only Hope" by Penick; as the offertory, "O God in Heaven, Look Down on Me" by Penick; and as the postlude, "Holy God, We Praise Thy Name" by Peeters.

Proctor is an ordained minister of the American Baptist Convention. He studied at the Virginia State College and received his bachelor of arts degree from the Virginia Union University and his bachelor of divinity degree from the Crozer Theological Seminary.

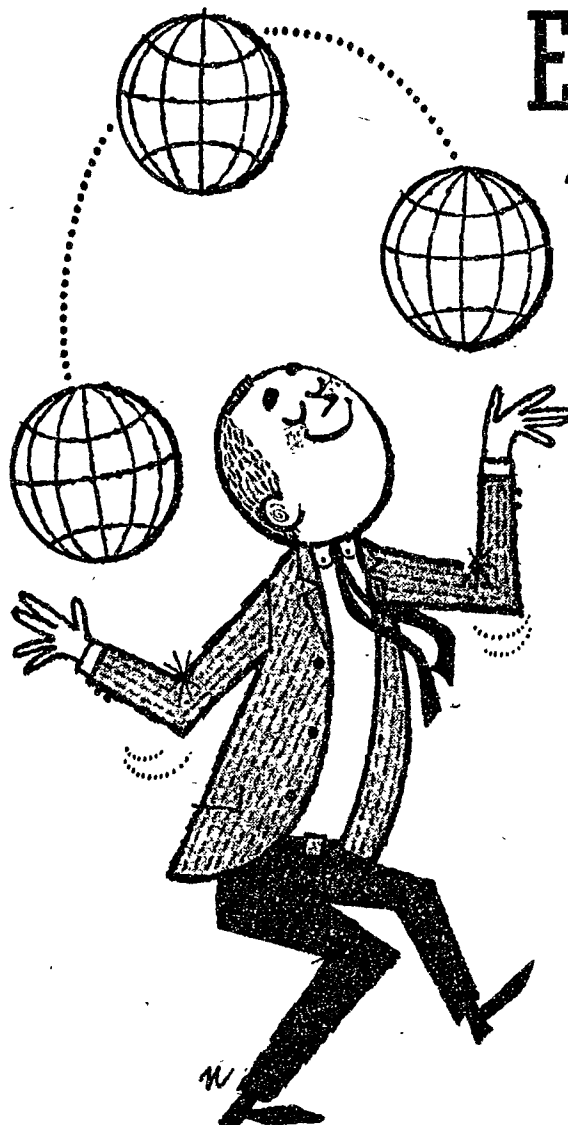
