

Van Doren to Open Education Seminar

Mark Van Doren, author and professor of English at Columbia University, will speak in a 3-part "Seminar on Excellence of Teaching in a Large University," at 8 p.m. Thursday in 10 Sparks.

Van Doren's lecture will be the first of the series sponsored by the Office of the Vice President for Academic Affairs.

A graduate of the University of Illinois, Van Doren received his master of arts and doctor of philosophy degrees from Columbia University.

In his 39-year teaching career he has taught many undergraduates who have gone on to literary fame, such as Jacques Barzun, author and dean of Columbia's graduate faculties; and Clifton Fadiman.

As an author, he has produced more than 50 books including verse, fiction, critical works and an autobiography. He was awarded the 1940 Pulitzer Prize for Poetry for his "Collected Poems."

His first play, "The Last Days of Lincoln," will be produced next fall in New York. Among

his recent books are: "The Autobiography of Mark Van Doren," 1958; "Home With Hazel and Other Stories," 1957; "Don Quixote's Profession," a criticism, 1958; and "Selected Poems," 1954

Van Doren will retire from teaching in May, and wants to devote his time to producing his play and writing poetry.

His topic for the seminar will be "The Teacher and the Student." "A career of teaching isn't a career of highlights. You're not looking for boys who will become famous men. Your concern is 'what can these boys understand?'" he said as quoted in Newsweek.

The second speaker will be Dr. Edward Hodnett, formerly chairman of the Department of English at Ohio University and now assistant to the president of the Dow-Corning Corp. He will speak at 8 p.m. March 12 in 10 Sparks.

A panel discussion comprised of faculty members will be the final program at 8 p.m. March 18 in 121 Sparks.
