

Hoopsters Finish Season With Rematch at Bucknell

The Nittany Lions of Penn State will close out the 1958-59 basketball season tonight when they travel to Lewisburg to play Bucknell at 8 p.m. in Davis Gymnasium.

The Lions will be after win number 12. They have lost eight. One of those losses was an 80-67 setback at the hands of Bucknell at Rec Hall in January.

Bucknell will carry a record of 16-6 into tonight's tilt. Until two weeks ago they were breezing along with hopes of going to the NCAA tournament as representatives of the Middle Atlantic Conference.

But then came three straight losses to St. Josephs, Lafayette and Delaware and the Bisons suddenly found themselves out of the running.

The Thundering Herd packs a double scoring punch in Hal "Moose" Danzig and Ellis Harley. Danzig is the leading scorer and Harley is just a few points behind him. Both have 17-point averages.

In addition to being the leading scorer, Danzig is the team rebound leader with an average of 18.7 per game. In fact that mark is the 7th best in the nation.

Harley and Danzig will be joined by Bob Ericsson, Tommy Thompson and Jack Flanagan in the Bucknell starting lineup.

Penn State will counter with its veteran lineup of sophomore Mark DuMars and Wally Colender at guards, Paul Sweetland and Bob Edwards at forwards and Tom Hancock at center.

DuMars is the leading scorer on the Nittany five this season with 319 points in 19 games for an

average of 16.7 points per game. Colender is right behind DuMars with an average of 16.3.

DuMars recently received Honorable Mention honors on the United Press International All-American team.

Hancock and Edwards will be playing their last games for the Nittany Lions in tonight's game against the Bisons.

Another senior Ted Kubista broke his ankle right after the Bucknell game last January and

is expected to miss the remainder of the season.

The Nittany Lions will play their final game of the season at 8 p.m. tonight at Lewisburg.

5 Spikemen Enter K of C Games

Five Nittany spikers will compete with an outstanding assemblage of track talent in the invitational Knights of Columbus Games in Madison Square Garden tonight.

Bob Brown, Don Davies, Dick Engelbrink, Fred Kerr and Ed Moran, under the tutelage of Coach Chick Werner, will run in the last big indoor competition in the East.

Brown, the lone individual entry, will race in the 60-yard dash. One of Brown's rivals will be Villanova's Ed Collymore who barely outdove Brown to the wire in the IC4-A championships last Saturday.

Collymore originally entered both the 60-yard dash and 600-

yard run at the K of C Games but withdrew from the 600 to concentrate on the sprint.

Collymore's switch indirectly brought about a change in the lineup of Manhattan's two-mile relay team which squares off against the Lions' foursome in the most publicized race of the evening.

The 600 slot vacated by Collymore was awarded to Art Evans, Manhattan sophomore who was scheduled to run a leg on Coach George Eastment's two-mile aggregation.

Eastment decided to double Evans on his one-mile relay team and replaced him with John Horton on the two-mile crew.

Kye Courtney, the fleet Jasper who contracted the measles Sunday morning after anchoring Manhattan's two-mile baton-passers to victory in the IC4-A journey, has been cleared by

the doctors to run again tonight.

Werner's countering quartet will have Davies running the first leg followed by Kerr on the second half-mile jaunt. Kerr will pass the baton to Engelbrink who will set the stage for anchor man Moran.
