

'Snowed Out' Stickmen Only Second, Shortstop Posts To Open With Loyola Seem Clinched on Lion 'Nine'

The Nittany Lion lacrosse team will get another chance to open the 1959 season Saturday when it entertains Loyola of Baltimore at 2 p.m. on Beaver Field.

Snowed out of the original opener with Hofstra a week ago, the Lions will be out to improve on their 5-8 record of 1958.

Loyola brings an 0-1 record into tomorrow's game. The Greyhounds dropped their opener to Washington and Lee, 15-0, last week.

Washington and Lee completely outplayed the Greyhounds according to newspaper reports, and had a 6-0 lead before Loyola could score.

Then Jim Lamar broke into the scoring column for Loyola with two quick goals. Three other players—Bill Sammelton, Jerry Beck, and Jim Kelly also scored.

However, the Greyhounds hold a strong potential threat with a large portion of the team composed of freshmen and sophomores.

Beck, Kelly, and Paul Flatery are three returning lettermen who will help fill the weak spots on the Loyola Roster.

The Lions should hold a decided edge over the Greyhounds this Saturday as the stickmen have one of their strongest teams according to Lion Coach Earnie Baer.

The defensive picture, Baer said, is the most powerful aspect of the Nittany squad this season with Dave Erwin, Dick Dill, and Mike Beattie forming the bulwark. Andy Moconyi and Tom Ogden will fill in for any of the starting defensive three.

The goaltenders job is still being hotly contended for between Dave Wilkinson and John Costello. Wilkinson still holds a slight edge but if his ankle continues to bother Costello could get the starting nod.

The midfield will find Bob Swanson, Ray Tuleya, and Dick Bullock in the starting slots followed by Earl Henderson, Dick Hammond, and Dick Janda on the second unit.

John Behne will head the attack group along with Jim Winpenny and Bill McDonough. Jim Kane could push McDonough for his starting job as he has been constantly improving. Lee Herman will be the other secondary

With opening day less than a week away, Joe Bedenk's baseballers had to miss another full scale practice session due to bad weather.

The muddy field didn't keep the Lion batterymen from working out, though, and the rest of the squad managed to get in a little throwing and a few games of pepper.

But time is precious now as far as the Nittany nine is concerned, for its opening day opponent Wednesday—Gettysburg—has already beaten Syracuse, 9-0, and plays Wilkes College tomorrow.

Bedenk hasn't figured out who will be in the starting lineup when the season starts next week.

Only two positions—second base and shortstop—could be called "set" as of yesterday.

Bedenk has veteran Larry Fegley at second and 2-year letter-

man Bob Hoover at short. Both were standouts last year.

Bedenk also has his leading hitter back in senior Doug Caldwell, but the Lion outfielder has been student teaching and only began practicing a week ago.

Caldwell hit .333 last year platooning with Joe Moore in center field. There's no doubt, in anyone's mind that he can hit right-handers but he is still a question mark against the southpaws.

The only other experienced returnee is pitcher Ron Riese who finished with a 6-1 log last season. He will undoubtedly be the number one hurler this year.

"After that, you tell me," said Bedenk. "I'd have to say that this is one of the most inexperienced teams I've had."

That, incidentally, takes in a span of 30 years as a Lion coach.
