

# Lion Spikers to Run In Quantico Relays

The Blue and White trackmen lift the lid on the 1959 outdoor season today at the Quantico Marine Base in Virginia when they engage in the first day of the two-day Quantico relay carnival.

Coach Chick Werner's crew will enter a full team in the collegiate and amateur show. The Lions will enter six relay and nine individual events.

Captain Ed Moran and ace sprinter Bobby Brown will run in individual invitational events. Brown goes in the 100-yard dash feature this afternoon, while Moran will run in the invitational mile tomorrow.

The Lions' highly touted 4-mile relay team will consist of Moran, Dick Engelbrink, Charlie King and Herm Weber.

Sprinters Jim O'Connor, Bob Szezyler and Dick Hambricht will join Brown on a strong 880-yard relay team. Brown, Szezyler and O'Connor finished in a dead heat for their 220 jaunt in time trials last Saturday with clockings of 21.5, 21.58 and 21.6, respectively.

These same four speedsters will run in the 440-yard relay with each man sprinting 110. In the 100-yard time trials, Brown, Szezyler and Hambricht all ran under 10 seconds and O'Connor was right behind in 10 flat.

Two medley relays will also be run. The Lion distance medley foursome will be Hambricht, King, Engelbrink and Moran. Don Davies, Dave Truitt, George Metzgar and Bill Schwab compose the sprint medley relay squad.

John Ferreira and Truitt or John Williams will enter the 120-yard high hurdles.

John Tullar will lead the Nittany field crew in the day's opening events Tullar will be joined by Andy Nyce, Jon Musser and Jim Wambold in the discus throw. Ferreira is the only Penn State man in the high jump and Dick Gross is the lone broad jumper.

Tullar tossed the discus 158' 10" in last weekend's trials. Nyce's best heave was 142' 6".

The javelin, shot put and pole vault events will take place tomorrow.

Tullar and Nyce will put the shot and Gross, Ron Beard and Dale Peters will pole vault for the Lions. Nyce will also throw the spear along with Musser, Jim Schwab and Stratton Schaeffer.

Coach Werner will send Bill Schwab, King, Engelbrink and Davies or George Jones in the last relay—the 2-mile.

# LaX, Golf, Net Teams Play 'Tough' Home Tilts Tomorrow

Penn State's home spring sports season will get into full swing tomorrow when the lacrosse, golf and tennis teams take-on three tough opponents.

The Lion lacrosse team will be out to break the longest losing jinx in Penn State history tomorrow when it faces the Middies from Navy.

In 28 years of play, Navy has racked up a record of 28 consecutive wins. The Middies have not only won all these games but they have managed to compile at least a 10-point spread or better.

In last year's meeting, Navy trounced the Lions, 18-2. The closest that the Lions have come in the last five years was in 1957 when they scored 11 goals to Navy's 19.

This year Navy has compiled a 2-0 record, having edged Rutgers, 10-9, and Washington College, 8-6. Both of these squads usually rank in the top echelon of the nation's lacrosse teams.

Navy plays one of the strongest schedules in the nation, but still has managed to cop the National Intercollegiate Championships six times.

However, the Lions will have two things in their favor in tomorrow's game. One is that Captain Bill Mitchell, Navy's best midfielder, will be out of action

due to injuries. The other is that the Navy defense is weaker than usual, thus giving the Nittany attack a better chance to score.

The Middies main strong-point is their well-balanced attack. Barry Byrne shapes up as Navy's best man on attack. He was the sole player to score more than one goal in the Washington College game. Russ Whipps and Hod Wells round out the starting Navy attack. Whipps will most likely take the role of the playmaker on offense.

Navy Coach Bill Bilderbeck has moved Karl Ripplermire, an attackman, back to a midfield slot to replace the injured Mitchell. Ripplermire will most likely prove to be the key man in the midfield because he did excellent work on attack in the past two games, Lion Coach Earnie Baer said.

If any comparison can be made between the two teams, it can be noted that Navy crushed Loyola, 18-2, in a scrimmage game this season while the Lions stopped the same Loyola Ten, 14-3, in their opener last Saturday.

If the Lions are going to beat the Middies, this may be the year to do it, and Coach Baer has high hopes that they'll be able to do it.

Penn State's linksmen will also face a tough opponent as they hope to get back in the win column against the Quakers of Pennsylvania.

Coach Joe Boyle figures Penn

to be one of the toughest teams the Lions will face this season. The Quakers have an experienced squad returning.

Bob Warbury, one of four returning lettermen, is among Penn's best, Boyle said. Last year against the Lions, Warbury defeated ex-captain Pat Reilly, 2 up.

Warbury was undefeated in dual meet competition last year, although he did not come through too well in the Easterns—losing his first match after qualifying.


Another returning letterman, Bob Goldsonit, played Bill Davidson, Nittany captain and defending Eastern champ. and lost, 5 and 3.

Penn has already played one match this year, defeating the Lehigh Engineers, 6-1. Last year the Lions took the Quakers in a triangular meet which included Villanova, by a 5-2 score.

The Nittany tennis squad will be in the same boat as the Lion lacrosse and golf teams tomorrow when it takes on the Big Red of Cornell.

Cornell features a veteran team this season for the majority of last year's winning. (Continued on page eight)
