

Stickmen Will Host Penn Braves Edge Phils In Attempt to Save Face In Ten Inning Tilt

With its prestige gone after the crushing Navy defeat, the Lion lacrosse team today will try to regain the spirit and determination it had earlier in the season. The stickmen meet Penn at 3:30 p.m. today on Beaver Field.

"If we play the type of lacrosse we're capable of playing, we should be able to take them today," commented Coach Earnie Baer.

"This game will give us a good opportunity to redeem ourselves as the competition will be on a more even basis," Baer went on.

As a matter of interest it may be noted that the Navy game Saturday was by far the worst game the Lions ever played. No other team before had ever scored more than 22 goals on the Lions but Navy managed to top this record by 7 goals as they wracked up 29 tallies.

The bulwark in the Penn lineup today will be its All-American goalie, Dave Buten. Buten made 275 saves last season against some of the best teams in the country.

Last year the Lions overcame the Philadelphians by the narrow margin of 3-2. In 22 years of play against the Quakers, the Nittany stickmen have won 13, dropped 8, and tied 1.

Coach Baer has been trying to recharge his defense into the powerful unit it once was before the Navy game.

"Our defense proved to be our weakest point in the Navy game. The goaltenders position in particular will need a lot of work," Baer said.

"Our goalie, Dave Wilkinson, let quite a few shots past on Saturday that he should have been able to stop. However, this was the first complete game he ever played so he could snap out of it before the season is over," he continued.

"We don't know whether Penn will use the zone or man-to-man defense so we have prepared for both," Baer concluded.

The defensive starting lineup will find Mike Beattie back in his original slot along with co-captain Dick Dill and Dave Erwin.

However, the Lion midfield will be at its lowest ebb without the services of versatile Bob Swanson. "Swanny" will be out of service for the Penn game due to a charleyhorse.

Coach Baer will either use the second midfield as the starting unit or else replace Swanson

with Earl Henderson. If the original starting midfield is used, Ray Tuleya and Dick Bullock will be used along with Henderson.

The second midfield will consist of Dick Hammond, Gove Elder, and Henderson if he is not used in the starting lineup.

Baer could also pull a switch on attack with Jim Kane replacing Bill McDonough. Co-captain John Behne and Jim Winpenny will fill in the remaining two slots.
