

25 ICG Members To Attend Conclave

Twenty-five University students will attend the Intercollegiate Conference on Government convention to be held in Harrisburg this weekend.

The convention, which starts today and ends Saturday, will be attended by about 500 students from 50 Pennsylvania colleges.

The weekend program will open with a dinner dance Thursday night at which students will be welcomed by Governor David L. Lawrence, the mayor of Harrisburg, the majority and minority leaders of the Senate and the House of Representatives and Genevieve Blatt, executive director of the Intercollegiate Government program and Secretary of Internal Affairs.

Tomorrow students will elect convention officers and 10 pre-arranged committees will meet to consider model bills. Carl Smith, junior in psychology from Scranton, will act as chairman of the Committee on Taxation and Finance.

Each of the committees will report on a maximum of three bills to the main session Friday night and Saturday morning. The bills

will be discussed and a committee will select the best of those passed. The winning bill will win an award and be presented to the state legislature.

The purpose of the Intercollegiate Government organization and the coming convention is to enable students to gain practical insight into politics by active participation.

Mr. Lee Corter, assistant professor of political science, is advisor to the University chapter and Ralph Volpe, senior in arts and letters from Lansdale, is the chapter chairman.

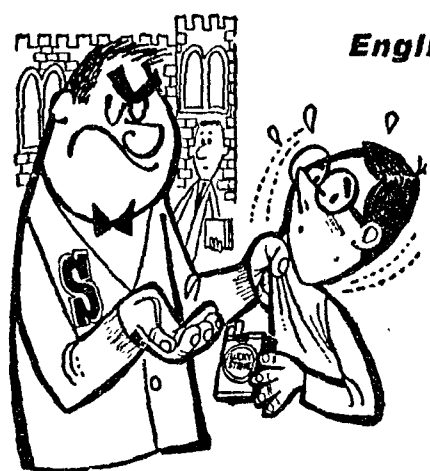

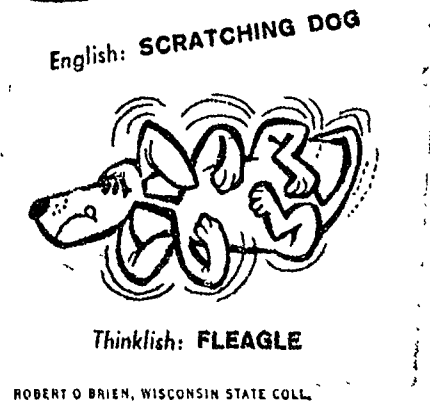

English: CAMPUS TOUGH GUY

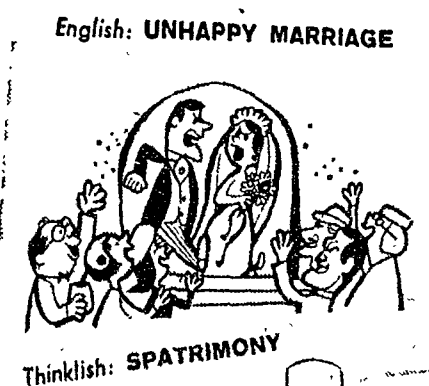

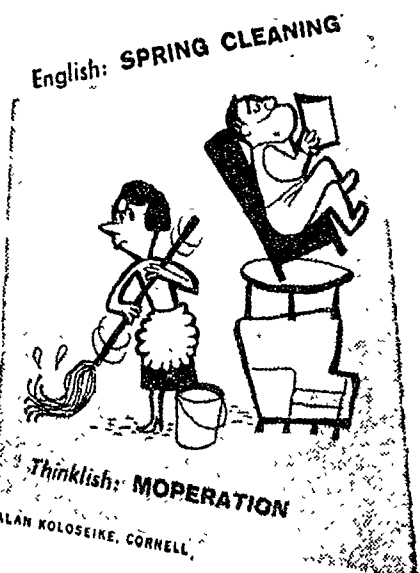

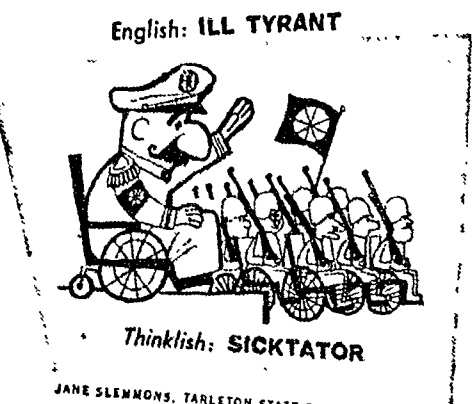
