# SDX Plans Smoker For Anniversary

The University Chapter of Sigma Delta Chi, men's professional journalistic fraternity, will celebrate the fiftieth anniversary of the fraternity's founding with a smoker for prospective members at 7:30 p.m. tomorrow at Phi Sigma Kappa fraternity.

The fraternity was founded by 10 men at DePauw University in Greencastle, Ind., April 17, 1909. At present, membership in the fraternity totals over 16,000 writers, reporters, editorialists, journalism students and newspaper executives.

The University chapter, one of the 71 undergraduate chapters located at accredited journalism schools, was founded 26 years ago. Membership in the local chapter presently is 15. There are 52 professional chapters for newsmen presently in the journalism field.

Speaker at the smoker tomorrow will be Marlow Froke, assistant professor from Illinois University who is currently teaching radio-television journalism here.

Those eligible for undergraduate membership in Sigma Delta Chi are news and editing majors of fourth semester standing or higher who plan to go into news reporting or writing.

Nominations and elections of chapter officers for next year will also be held at tomorrow's business meeting scheduled for 6:30 p.m.

From the periodicals department are newspapers and magazines from foreign countries. The newspapers include *The London Times*, *El Universal* from Mexico, *Le Figaro* from Italy, and *Le Monde* from France. There are magazines on display from the Netherlands, Mexico, England, Germany, Pakistan and South Africa.

From the reference department are shown a number of maps from a collection of 60,000 to be found in that department. Also from reference are various pamphlets concerning the United Nations.

Display cases on the second floor of the library are devoted to the library's record department and the microfilm and microcard department. The record collection contains everything from readings by Faulkner to jazz by Louis Armstrong. Language records in French, Spanish, Norwegian, German, Italian, Portuguese and Russian are available.

Language and speech records can be obtained at the stack entrance desk, and must be used in the library. The Junior Class record collection which consists of musical comedy and classical records can be obtained in room 107 and circulate for three days.

From the microfilm department are displayed Russian documents, the Adams Manuscript Trust, the British Sessional Papers and various newspapers.

Freshmen must sign out for the special permissions.

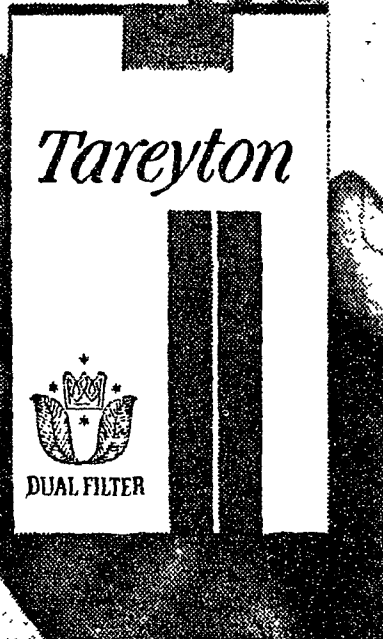
Upperclass women will have their regular 10 p.m. permissions.
