## a Nobel scientist speaks:

"Sometimes I think that I am dreaming; I can hardly believe that the world is as it is. The world is beautiful, wonderful-scientists every year uncover discover. and more wonders of organic and inorganic nature. Man is wonderful organism-the human body, with its millions of millions of cells, molecules of many different kinds enlering into chemical reactions with one another; the human mind, capable of feats of complex calculation, of absiract reasoning infinitely beyond
"Man has developed admirable principles of morality. which in large part govern the actions of individual human beings. And yet, we are murderers, mass murderers. Almost all of us, even many of our religious leaders, accept with equanimity a world policy of devoting a large pari of our world income, our world resources-one hundred billion dollars a year-to the cold-blooded readying of nuclear weapons to kill hundreds of millions of people, to damage the pool of human germ plasm in such a way that after a great nuclear war our descendants might be hardly recognizable as human beings.

Does the Commandment 'Thou Shalt Not Kill' mean nothing to us? Are we to interpret it as meaning 'Thou shalt not kill except on the grand scale,' or 'Thou shalt not kill except when the national leaders say to do so?'

I am an American, deeply interested in the welfare of my fellow Americans, of our great Nation. But I am first of all a human being. I believe in MORALITY. Even if it were possible (which it is not) to purchase security for the United States of America by killing all of the hundreds of millions of people behind the Iron Curtain without doing any harm to anyone else, I would not be willing that it bo done.
'I believe that there is a greater power in the world than the evil power of military force, of nuclear bombsthere is the power of GOOD, of MOHALITY, of HUMAN. ITARIANISM.
"I believe in the power of the human spirit. I should like to see our great Nation, the United States of America, take the lead in the fight for good, for peace, against the evil of war.
"During the past hundred years there have been astounding developments in science and technology, de velopments that have completely changed the nature of the world in which we live. So far as I can see, the nature of diplomeay, of the conduct of international affairs, has changed very little.

The time has now come for this aspect of the world to change, because we now recognize that the power to destroy the world is a power that cannot be used.

May our great Nation . . . be the leader in bringing MORALITY into its proper place of prime importance in the conduct of world affairs!
