 "is just silly," Pauling commented. "We have to stop this idiotic race towards death." Diplomacy and threats of retaliation are out-moded. We should put our money and effort into sane, rational research for peace, not underground shelters that are of little use, he said.
 He said also that it is only logical to recognize China and include her in the United Nations as the real nation she is. China would add to the world threat as an H-bomb nation, he said.
 "I believe there will not be another great world war," Pauling concluded. But he called on every American to work with committees and individually to preserve themselves and their country from destruction.

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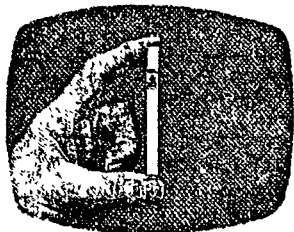

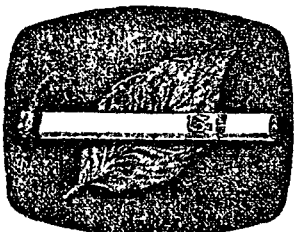

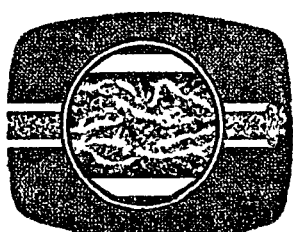
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
