

## Sea Traffic Starts Parade -- In St. Lawrence

MONTREAL (AP)—A fleet of ocean-going vessels tugged at anchor last night awaiting the start of major sea commerce for the heartland of North America, up to 2400 miles from the Atlantic.

The St. Lawrence Seaway, freed from winter's icy hold, opens today as a \$475 million cooperative venture financed by U.S. and Canadian taxpayers.

Sixty salt water ships, dressed in flags, bunting and fresh paint, were anchored near Montreal to form part of the first convoy of long, deep-draft vessels to pass westward along the St. Lawrence River.

Fourteen more ships waited at Ogdensburg, N.Y., to join the fleet from almost every maritime nation.

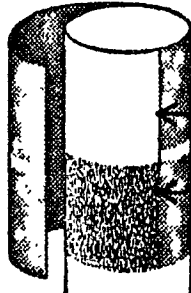
