

25 Hot Rods Shown In Pacers' Display

Hot rodders from miles around roared into the Hetzel Union parking lot Sunday to display their achievements at the invitation of the Penn State Pacers, a rapidly developing motor club on campus.

Twenty-five cars, including two owned by University students, were entered in the show. Most of the award winners were from the Lancaster-Hanover area, but entries came from Maryland and West Virginia as well. The cars were divided into six classes.

The Pacers' president, Richard G. Robinson, junior in business administration from Glenside, won second place in the Pre-War Coupe Sedan class with his 1935 Ford coupe featuring a 1955 Chevrolet engine. Paul Cuppett, senior in business administration from Johnstown, entered his 1957 Plymouth Fury in the Semi-Custom class. It has a 1958 Plymouth bottom grill and has been "shaved and decked."

The Best in Show Award was presented to Clair Nece from Hanover for his 1930 Model A Roadster. Robinson said it had extensive chrome plating and custom interior work and contained a 1953 DeSoto engine that had been chopped and channeled.

According to Robinson, the other five winners were:

- A 1932 Ford coupe in the Pre-War Coupe Sedan class owned by Bud Connis from Maryland. It had a 1947 full-race Mercury engine, brown upholstery and was in "emmaculate" condition, he said.
- A 1953 Ford in the Post-War

Coupe Sedan class owned by Donald Ellnaker from Lancaster. It contained a 1956 Buick engine.

• A 1955 Chevrolet in the Semi-Custom class owned by Tom Harnish from Hanover. Robinson said it had 1956 Packard tail lights, minor body work and a custom paint job.

• A 1947 Chevrolet hardtop in the Full Custom class owned by Jerry Downing of Lancaster. Robinson said it had originally been a coupe and had been transformed. It had a 1956 Chevrolet engine, and Oldsmobile grill. Most of the original chrome was removed.

• A 1930 Model A Roadster Pickup in the Unfinished class owned by Gary McLaughlin of Lancaster. Robinson described it as having been chopped and channeled, containing a full-race 1947 Mercury engine and outstanding mechanical work.

Entries were judged by Dean Stanton, a member of the National Hot Rod Association. They were judged on amount of work done, engine conversion, speed equipment and overall appearance.

The Penn State Pacers was chartered in 1952 by the National Hot Rod Association. The club now has 30 student members.

The club meets every Monday night at 7 p.m. in 105 Walker Lab.
