

Tickets Left For Lecture By Bridges

A total of 602 student tickets remain for Senator Styles Bridges' lecture tonight.

Three hundred and ninety eight student tickets have been distributed at the Hetzel Union desk and 11 non-student tickets were sold at \$1.25 each. One hundred and thirty nine non-student tickets remain.

Bridges' lecture, "A Conservative Speaks Out," will begin at 8 in Schwab Auditorium.

Senator Bridges, chairman of the Republican Policy Committee of the Senate, will fly to the campus tomorrow afternoon, where members of the Lecture Series Committee will meet him.

A press conference has been scheduled at the Nittany Lion Inn at 5 p.m.

Senator Bridges will be introduced by Jay Feldstein, retiring All-University president.

Senator Bridges was elected governor of New Hampshire in 1934, the youngest state governor in the nation at the time.

Two years later he was elected to the Senate, and has served there ever since.

Bridges lecture is the third in the Lecture Series. The first two lectures were given by Eleanor Roosevelt and by Clement Attlee.
