

Dulin Will Address Protestant Service

"An Owner Without a Deed" will be the topic of Richard Dulin's sermon for the Protestant Service of Worship at 9 a.m. tomorrow in the Helen Eakin Eisenhower Chapel.

Dulin is the Danforth Intern at the University this year and assistant director of the University Christian Association.

Grad Dean To Speak At Chapel

Dr. Harold K. Schilling, dean of the Graduate School and professor of physics, will speak on "Creeds as Symbols" at the University Chapel service of worship at 10:55 a.m. tomorrow in Schwab Auditorium.

The Chapel Choir, directed by Willa Taylor, will sing as choral introit "Creator Spirit, by Whose Aid" by Thomas Tallis. Arthur Bliss' arrangement of "Seek Ye the Lord" will be the anthem. University Organist George E. Ceiga will play "Praeludium" by Van den Gheyn, as the prelude; "I Will Sing My Maker's Praises" by Karg-Elert, as the offertory; and "Fugato" by Van den Gheyn as the Postlude.

Schilling holds degrees from the University of Nebraska, the University of Iowa and Bucknell University.

A native of Allentown, Pa., Schilling was professor of physics and dean at Union College in Lincoln, Neb., for 17 years. He joined the faculty of the College of Chemistry and Physics here in 1941 and in 1950 was named to his present post.

Schilling is an active churchman of the United Church of Christ in the continuing dialogue between the church and the University. He is a fellow of the National Council on Religion in High Education, the American Physical Society and American Association for the Advancement of Science. He has served as a member of the governing board of the American Institute of Physics.

A careful search, which included checking phone booths, Spring Week floats and carnival booths, failed to reveal any trace of the missing plant.

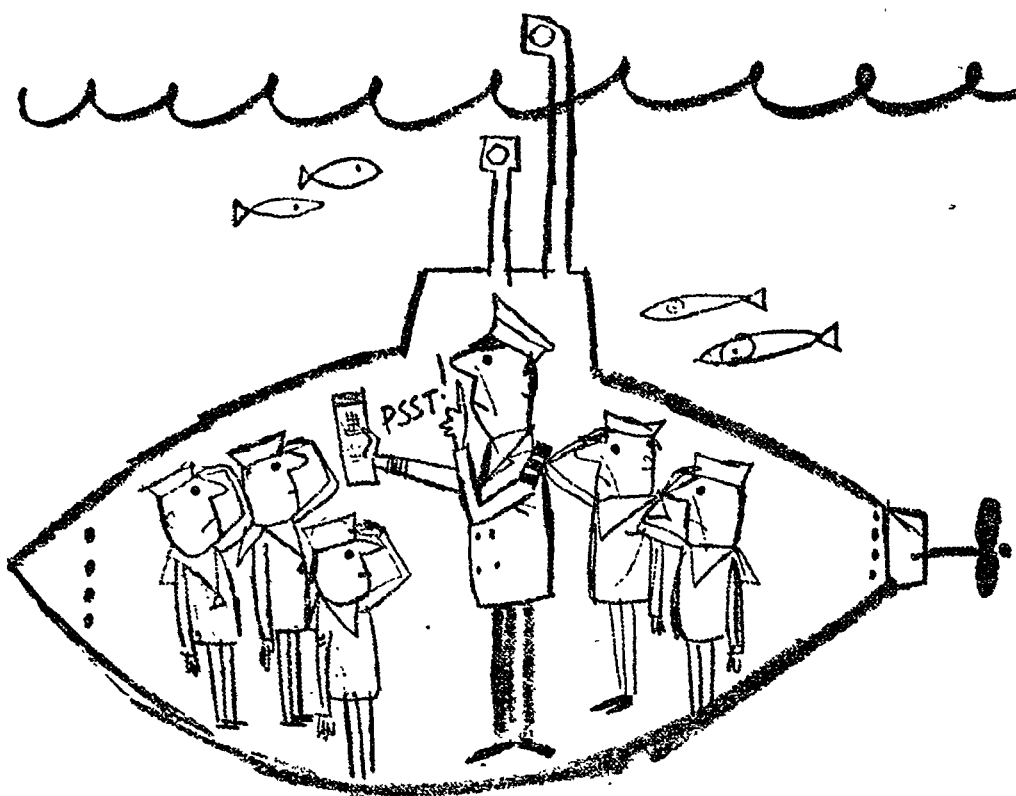
