

# Cricket Club to Play 1st Game Since '54

The first cricket game to be played at Penn State since 1954 will begin at 1:30 p.m. today at the State College Airport.

The Wayfarers Cricket Club, in a renewal of club activities, will meet Howard University of Washington, D.C. This will be the third game of the season for Howard University, and Penn State's first.

A "tea" will be given for the players during the game at a time to be set by the mutual agreement of the team captains. The "tea" will be served by a sorority on campus.

Dr. Robert McCammon, professor of physics and captain of the Wayfarers, expressed his hope that this game will initiate a "glorious future" for cricket here and that the club will continue to grow and become a part of the University life.

McCammon also pointed out the

need for strong support of the team by undergraduate students. He said that one of the primary ambitions of the Wayfarers is the formation of a 2-team squad. This will not only provide for inter-squad competition but will also enable the club to have a touring team, he commented.

The present Wayfarers Cricket Club boasts members from all over the world including the Caribbean, the Middle East, and the British Isles. Roderick Thomas, the team's whicket-keeper, and Michael Stillmeyer, a bowler, are both from Jamaica.

The team captain, McCammon, is a native of Ireland. The other players, there are about 20 on the squad, include students and faculty members from most of the colleges on campus.

In the only other game scheduled for this spring, the Wayfarers will meet the British Embassy at Washington, D.C. on May 30.

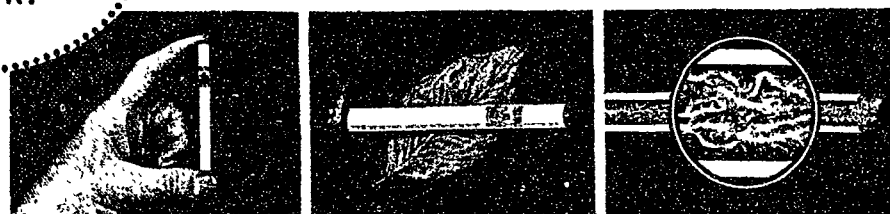
