Mortar Board, senior women's hat society, has awarded \$100 scholarships to six women students.

The Helen Eakin Eisenhower Memorial Scholarship was awarded to Dorothy Baker at the Pottsville Center. This scholarship was established in 1955 in memory of Mrs. Milton Eisenhower, a Mortar Board adviser.

Recipients of five \$100 awards from the Charlotte E. Ray Fund were Eniko Bornemisza, sophomore in arts and letters from Ligonier; Bernice Bongiorno, junior in arts and letters from Erie; Judith Kirchner, junior in education from Latrobe; Doris Har-riff, junior in music education from Richardsville; and Barbara Malicki, sophomore in home economics from Osceola Mills.

This fund was established in 1946 in honor of Miss Ray upon her retirement from her position as dean of women.

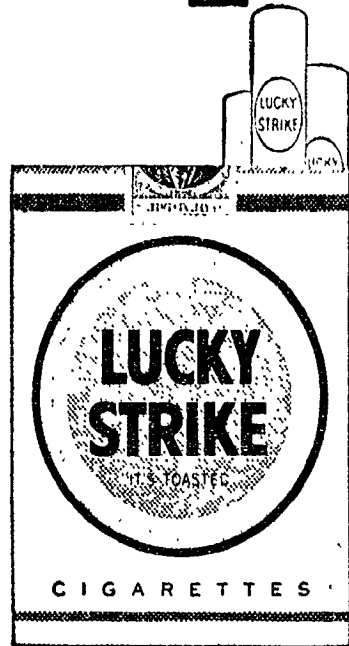

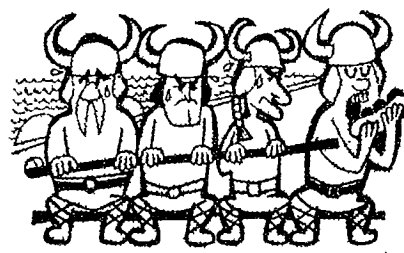

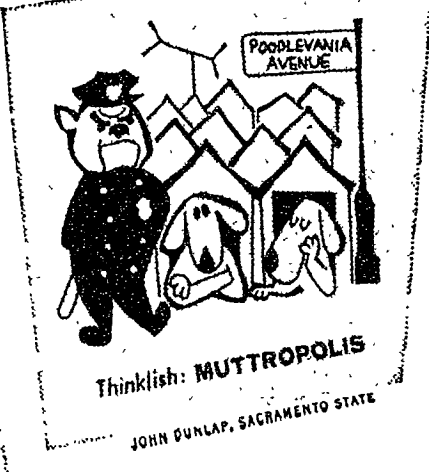
