

Guignol Productions To 'Shock' Campus

The problems of a theatre production are greatly multiplied in the experimental theatre production which opens at 8 tonight at the Little Theatre in Old Main.

The three one-act plays are being produced in the style of the Grand Guignol theatre, famous in Paris for its gruesome make up effects and criminal plays. Another performance will be given at 8 p.m. tomorrow.

As the Guignol theatre keeps its make up technique a secret, the make up crew, headed by Carolyn Wenzel, has had to experiment with different make up bases and objects found around the house.

The crew decided to use a latex and Kleenex base to build up face distortions for such effects as fatness and beakness.

The face is first coated with the wet, sticky rubber material and then dry Kleenex is added to give the desired distortion.

The crew also needed a mixture to give "scarey" effect. They ordered a base called derma which has been found very effective when used by mortician.

Another problem was blood which the Guignol theatre makes every day by the vat. The crew ordered a pint of pancratol blood, a heavy liquid the color of grape juice which when dried looks and clots like real blood.

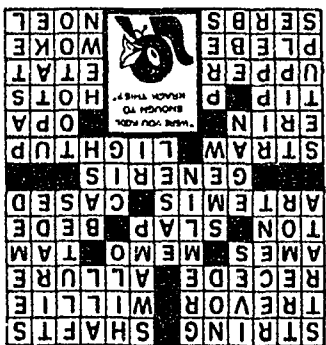
The three plays being produced are: "Weekend Cottage" and "Coals of Fire," by Frederick Witney, a British writer, and "Sweeney Todd," adapted by Marvin Katz, director.

Richard Mazza is technical director and Janet Abele and Charlotte Sidewater are stage managers. Crew heads for the production are Carolyn Wenzel, make up; Shirley Greenbaum, properties; Robert Kelley, publicity and sound; Sybil Sheer, lighting; Judy Gordon, construction; and Juriel Liney, costumes.

Compromise Marks Start of Geneva Talks--

(Continued from page one) U.S. Secretary of State Christian A. Herter, British Foreign Secretary Selwyn Lloyd and French Foreign Minister Maurice Couve de Murville balked.

Lloyd, chairman of the first session, moved in to mediate the clash that threatened to deadlock the conference even before its formal opening.

In a swift series of meetings, the Western leaders first conferred at Lloyd's villa. They then

sent the British foreign secretary to Gromyko with compromise proposals.

The Big Four ministers then postponed the formal opening, and met informally at a British villa to seek a formula for settling the German participation question.

After a full day of crossfire, they came up with this arrangement:

Representatives of the rival governments of West and East

Germany will attend the conference sessions. They will sit at separate tables.

If either the West or East German representative wants to speak, the conference chairman will ask if any of the other Big Four foreign ministers objects. If there are no objections, the floor will be given to the Germans.
