

University Gets Grant For Rat Study Project

The University has received a grant of \$10,000 for a 2-year period, beginning July 1, for the renewal of the research project, "The Relationship of Vitamin B6 to Protein Metabolism During Pregnancy in the Rat."

The grant was given by the Nutrition Foundation and Ruth L. Pike, associate professor of foods and nutrition, is directing the study. Previous study has been made on the total protein in the plasma, hemoglobin, nitrogen balance, blood volumes and extra cellular fluid.
