WUS Drive Collects \$500 For School Aid

Over \$500 was collected by the World University Service drive last week.

Preston H. Williams, assistant University chaplain and advisor to the World University Service committee, said yesterday a sum of \$539 had been collected but more contributions were expected from various campus groups.

The Professor Snarf contest netted \$136.97 for the fund, while a cookies sale held at fraternities added \$37.50.

Morris Movsovich, senior in business administration from Allentown, was general chairman for the campaign.

The World University Service committee is planning to hold a concert by the Chordettes, a female vocal group, in October. All proceeds from this performance will go to foreign students and schools in need of aid and relief.

Aero Eng Prof To Begin Study

Huon Li, assistant professor of aeronautical engineering, will conduct research in magnetogas-dynamics under a 1-year \$10,150 contract from the Combustion Division of the Air Research and Development Command of the U.S. Air Force.

Findings from Li's research could help solve the complex problems of the re-entry of satellites into the atmosphere from outer space and also could have application to problems of space propulsion and areas of outer space communication.

Li, who came to the University last year, received his bachelor of science degree from National Central University, Nanking, China, and his master and doctor of philosophy degrees from the University of California.

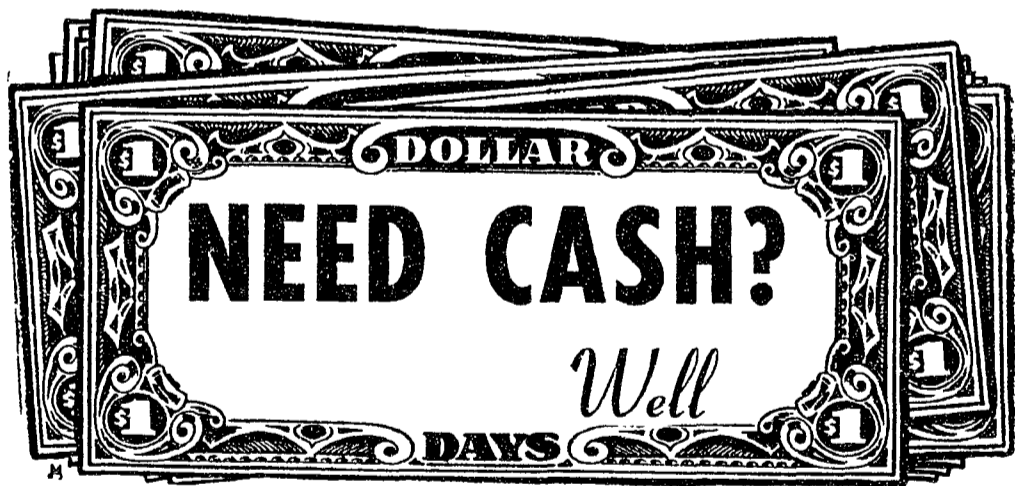
