Cutler is a native of Pennsylvania and a graduate of the University, where he received his bachelor of arts degree.

# Theologian Will Speak At Chapel

The Rev. Edmund A. Steimle, professor of practical theology at the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Philadelphia, will speak on the theme "The Constructive Uses of Doubt" at the University Chapel service of worship at 10:55 a.m. Sunday in Schwab Auditorium.

The Chapel Choir, directed by Willa Taylor, will sing as choral introit "Master of Eager Youth" as arranged by Williams. Persichetti's "Seek the Highest" will be the morning anthem.

University organist George E. Ceiga will play the allegro, adagio and finale from the "Chorale in A Minor" by Franck as prelude, offertory and postlude.

Steimle is a native of Allentown. He holds the bachelor of arts degree from Princeton University, the master of arts degree from the University of Pennsylvania and the bachelor of divinity from Mt. Airy Seminary in Philadelphia.

Steimle has preached on the National Radio Pulpit, the United Lutheran Series of the Protestant Hour and will broadcast weekly this summer on the National Broadcasting Company's "Art of Living" Series.

Author of a volume of sermons, "Are You Looking for God?" Steimle has also contributed articles to a number of religious publications.

He has served as a member of the biennial convention of the United Lutheran Church of America.

Serving as the leader of worship for the service will be Dr. Luther H. Harshbarger, University Chaplain and Co-ordinator of Religious Affairs and professor of religion in the College of the Liberal Arts.

He continued his studies at Harvard Law School until two years later when he entered the Virginia Theological Seminary upon his decision to go into the pastoral ministry. He received his bachelor of divinity degree from the Seminary before coming here in 1957.

Music for the service will be provided by the Meditation Chapel Choirs who will sing "Achieved Is the Glorious Work" from "The Creation" by Haydn. The choirs are under the direction of Willa Taylor and assistant director James Beach. Mary Herold will be the organist for the service.

Richard Dulin, assistant director of the University Christian Association, will lead in worship.

Dr. Edmund Steimle, professor of preaching at Mt. Airy Seminary, Philadelphia, will address the Lutheran Student Association at 6:30 p.m. Sunday. He will speak on "Faith in an Age of Anxiety."

The Presbyterian University Fellowship will hold a Communion Service of Worship at 6:30 p.m. Sunday.

A service will be held at 9:45 a.m. Sunday at the Wesley Foundation.


