

Lions Romp In IC4-As; Stop Jaspers

Penn State has had a long and glorious history in the world of track and field, but it will be some time before a Lion cinder squad ever duplicates the feat of the 1959 triads.

Coach Chick Werner's aggregation was the pride of the East this year, sweeping both the indoor and outdoor IC4-A team championships and recording an unbeaten 5-0 mark in outdoor dual competition.

The only other time that a Penn State team has won both the indoor and outdoor IC4-A titles was in 1942. But that year, the Nittanians were beaten in a regular season meet, ending the dual campaign at 5-1.

The Lions won each of its dual meets this season with relative ease. Typical of the overwhelming dual victories posted was the 99½ to 41½ rout over a supposedly-tough Manhattan team in the final meet of the year.

Three new Penn State records were set in that meet as the Lions placed in every event except the shot-put — sweeping the mile, two-mile, 220 and the pole vault. Ed Moran set a new standard in the 880, Jim Schwab broke a 21-year-old mark in the javelin and the mile relay team of George Metzger, Dave Davies, Moran and Dick Hambright romped off with the other record.

State's victory in the outdoor IC4-A championships — which signify Eastern track supremacy — was even more decisive. The Lions scored 29 more points than the nearest competitor — Maryland — beating the Terps by a 46½-17½ count.

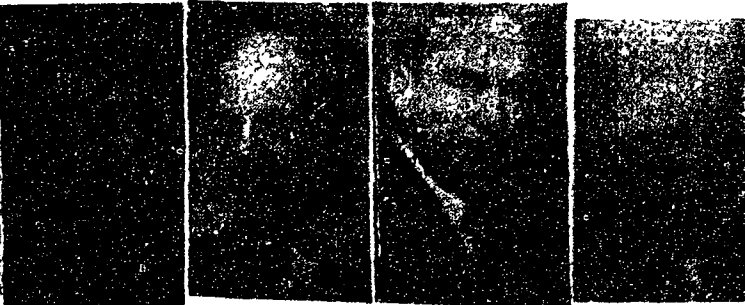
No less than four Lions emerged with individual IC4-A championships, including Moran (mile, 880), Engelbrink (two-mile), Bob Brown (100), and Bob Szezyler (220 low hurdles).

The Nittanians scored in 10 of the 16 IC4-A events — entering every event but the hammer throw.

Penn State's track team received a surprising honor from a most unusual source following its victory in the IC4-A championships last weekend.

The honor came in the form of a congratulatory resolution from the Pennsylvania Senate. The resolution commended the team for "going all out to bring the Commonwealth additional prestige," and noted that the team had "completed a sweep of college championships" in both the indoor and outdoor IC4-A meets.

Sens. Jo Hays (D-Centre), Harry E. Seyler (D-York), John Van Sant (R-Lehigh), Martin Silveri (D-Phila.) and Charles R. Mallery (R-Blair), sponsored the resolution which also praised Dr. Eric Walker, University president, track Coach Chick Werner, the squad and the student body.
