## Rayback to Head Labor Education

Dr. Joseph G. Rayback, professor of American history, has been named head of the Department of Labor Education.

The appointment, effective July 1, was announced yesterday by President Eric A. Walker. It was approved at the weekend meeting of the Board of Trustees.

Rayback has been acting head of the department since it was established a year ago as a unit of the College of the Liberal Arts.

The department administers the labor-management relations curriculum, conducts studies in the field of labor, and is responsible for instruction both on and off campus.

On June 30, he will complete a three-year term as head of the department of history. He will continue as professor of American history.

The action, announced today by President Eric A. Walker, was taken at the weekend meeting of the Board of Trustees. It will become effective July 1.

Dr. Merritt A. Williamson, dean of the College of Engineering and Architecture, explains that establishment of the new department was prompted by the need for incorporating into the College structure the engineering faculty members located at the Commonwealth Campuses.

The new department head will be responsible for the engineering faculty members at the Commonwealth Campuses, for the curriculums of engineering students on those campuses who are candidates for the baccalaureate and associate degrees; and for the work in engineering drawing and descriptive geometry. Faculty teaching these courses will be assigned to the new department.

He will also have responsibility for candidates for the bachelor of science degree without designation in a specific field.

# Stress Wave Symposium Set For June 30

An International Symposium on Stress Wave Propagation in Materials, to be held at the University from June 30 through July 3, will attract scientists from all parts of the United States and from several foreign countries.

Critical surveys of broad areas of theoretical and experimental research in the general field of stress wave propagation will be given by invited lecturers from the United States and abroad.

On the program will be speakers from India, Israel, France, England, Germany, Sweden and Japan, in addition to those from leading American universities and government and military laboratories. Participants in the symposium will exchange ideas concerning earthwave propagation and waves in metals and plastics.

Dr. Norman Davids, professor of engineering mechanics, is general chairman of the symposium which will be conducted by the department of engineering mechanics at the University under the sponsorship of the Office of Ordnance Research of the US Army.


# Summer Institute Enrolls Librarians
