

Faculty Participates In Alumni Institute

Nineteen University faculty members will participate in a series of panel discussions and lectures included in the Alumni Institute program to be held Friday.

The Ninth Annual Alumni Institute is part of the annual Alumni Class Reunion program which begins Thursday and continues until Sunday.

The panel discussion Friday morning and the series of 12 lectures Friday afternoon are open to the public and area residents may pick up free tickets for the programs at the alumni registration table in the Hetzel Union Building.

"American Culture from Auto to Atom" will be the title of the panel discussion at 10:30 a.m. Friday in the Assembly Room of the Hetzel Union Building.

Moderator of the panel will be Elburt F. Osborn, dean of the College of Mineral Industries. Members of the panel will be Dr. Paul M. Althouse, assistant director of resident instruction, College of Agriculture; Dr. Conard Fernelius, professor and head of the department of chemistry and head of the department of chemical engineering; Dr. Margaret B. Matson, assistant professor of sociology; and Dr. John J. Schanz Jr., associate professor of mineral economics.

At 2 p.m. Friday, the returning alumni will have their choice of attending one of six lectures by prominent members of the University faculty. Another group of six lectures will be presented at 3:30 p.m. in Osmond Laboratory.

Donovan Given Hetzel Award

Ellen R. Donovan was presented the Ralph Dorn Hetzel Memorial Award at the University's Commencement exercises Saturday.

The award is given to the senior student who has, in the opinion of the selection committee, achieved the best balance of high scholastic rank, good citizenship, activities and leadership. It is given in memory of Dr. Hetzel who was president of the University from 1926 until his death in 1947.

Miss Donovan compiled a 3.80 All-University average and served as president of the Women's Student Government Association; a member of the Women's Debate team; Mortar Board, senior women's honorary; and Phi Beta Kappa, national scholastic honorary.
