

# Book Maintenance Problem of Library

One of the most serious problems the Pattee Library faces throughout the year is that of keeping its literature in readable condition.

According to Mrs. Margaret Spangler, assistant librarian, scores of books and periodicals turn up each semester with complete pages torn out or with heavy pencil marks on many of the pages. When they are discovered the library must purchase either a back copy of the literature or a photostatic copy of the pages that are missing.

In the majority of cases, the library is unaware of the damage until another student reports it.

"Tracing individual responsi-

bility for the damage is an almost impossible job," said Mrs. Spangler.

Another problem is that of finding "lost" books. According to Mrs. Spangler, many of the books that are considered lost turn up at the end of the semester in vacated residence halls or are "dropped off in a hurry at the library."

Most of the literature mutilation appears to occur at the end of a semester "when the pressure is on and students must complete term papers," said Mrs. Spangler.

Besides causing an inconvenience to other students, the unauthorized removal and mutilation of literature costs the library a good deal of money. This money could be used to buy new books instead of back copies, she said.

Students who see books being mutilated should report the offender immediately to a librarian.

## Registration Open For Band School

Registration is still open for the University's annual Band, Orchestra and Chorus School for high school students to be held June 29 to Aug. 7.

Dr. Hummel Fishburn, head of the departments of music and music education and director of the summer program, said there are still some vacancies in the workshop, which last year enrolled more than 100 high school students.

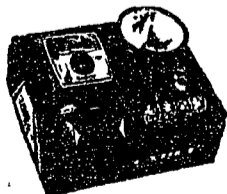

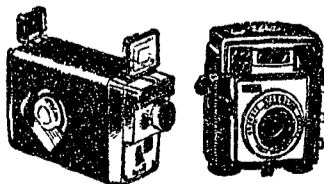

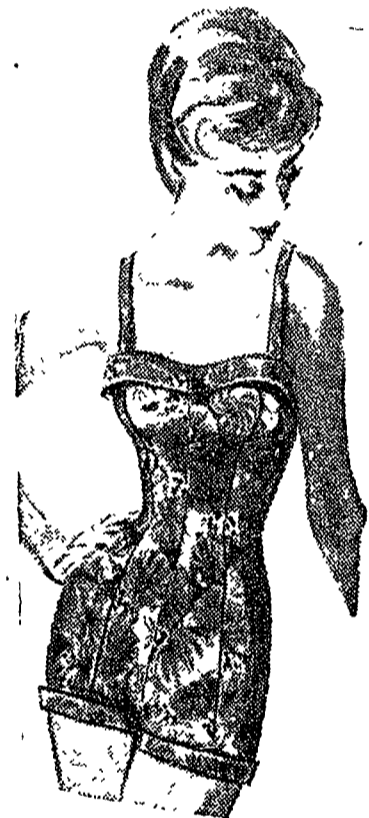
