25 Teachers To Participate In Conference

Twenty-five teachers from technical and junior high schools will open a conference Sunday on Instrumentation and Control.

The conference, which will end July 24, is sponsored by the National Science Foundation with teachers from all over the United States attending.

The purpose of the conference is to train the teachers in different areas of instrumentation and control. There are ten areas to be covered: pressure, temperature, flow, level, analysis, closed loop, open loop, process control, machine control and economics of instrumentation and control.

Classes will be held Monday through Saturday. During the conference, the members will make three inspection trips to the Sylvania plant in Altoona, West Virginia Pulp and Paper Co. in Tyone and a combined trip to the power plant, water tunnel and research laboratory at the University.

The twenty-five members were chosen by their academic background and experience after submitting applications.

80 to Enroll In Research Conference

Eighty engineers, physicists, mathematicians and scientists will enroll Sunday in the third annual Research and Management Development Conference.

The conference will end July 9.

The general theme of the seminar will be "Management Skills for Scientists in Supervision." The conference is designed to provide training for the research supervisor in planning, organizing and controlling his project so he can become a more efficient executive.

J. William Caldwell, assistant professor of industrial engineering and general chairman of the seminar, has prepared a program for those who wish to improve their skills in administrative techniques and human relations.

The speaker for the keynote address on Sunday will be Dr. Merritt A. Williamson, dean of the College of Engineering and Architecture.

Gilford G. Quarles, former Chief Scientist of the U.S. Army Ballistic Missile Agency at Redstone Arsenal, Alabama, and now the Chief Advisor to the Army Corps of Engineers, Washington D.C. will be the speaker Monday night.

Atmospheric Research

The University's Ionosphere Research Laboratory will continue its investigation of the lower atmosphere by "sweep frequency" techniques under a new 1-year, \$40,000 contract from the Air Research and Development Command of the U.S. Air Force.

Researchers, under the supervision of John Gibbons, professor of physics, are using a high-power radio transmitter to obtain a continuous record of the nature of radio waves reflected from the ionosphere.

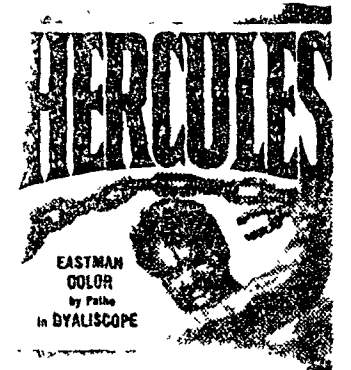
