Govt. Institute Will Sponsor Reports Contest

Plans for the eighth annual Municipal Reports competition, sponsored by the Institute of Local Government, have been announced by Lee E. Corter, associate professor of political science who is in charge of the competition.

The deadline for entry is Aug. 1. The contest, Corter explains, is offered to promote the publication of better municipal reports.

"Facts and information are worth little to the average citizen unless they are presented clearly and in orderly fashion and can be understood by the citizen," Corter says, reminding that the purpose of annual municipal reports is to inform citizens of the activities of their government, including how the tax dollar is spent.

County, city, borough and other municipal officials are doing an increasingly better job in making these reports, Corter believes, but he sees room for much improvement.

Winners of the competition will be announced Oct. 23 and 24 at meetings of Municipal Finance Officers
