

Choir Starts 3rd Tour Of Europe

The Chapel Choir of the University, composed of 67 students and recent graduates, today began in Oxford, England, a six-week tour of Europe.

It is the third such tour for the choir, which is directed by Willa C. Taylor, professor of music. Similar tours were completed in 1955 and 1957.

The trip this year will take the choir members to England, Germany, Poland, Denmark, Norway, Sweden, and Scotland. They will return to New York, N.Y., on Aug. 27 from Edinburgh.

As in past years, each member of the choir on the tour will pay his own expenses. The Choir will present a number of concerts, usually in churches, throughout the countries visited.

Dr. Frederick R. Matson, professor of archaeology, and his wife, Dr. Margaret B. Matson, assistant professor of sociology, are accompanying the group and conducting the educational phases of the program. They are responsible for orientation and also arrange for meetings of the group with leaders in education, government, art, and music in the countries visited.

Mrs. Taylor is assisted by James W. Beach, instructor in music and assistant choir director.

Quartet Will Present Lecture-Recital Friday

The Claremont Quartet will present its second in a series of lecture-recitals at 8:30 p.m. tomorrow in the Hetzel Union Building Assembly Room.

The string quartet is in residence during the Mid-Session.

Brooklyn Prof Will Present Public Lecture

Dr. Leonard S. Kenworthy, professor of education, Brooklyn College, will speak on "Meeting the Leaders of New Nations" at 8 p.m. today in 121 Sparks.

Kenworthy's speech is sponsored by the International Understanding Workshop. He is a former director of the workshop.

Kenworthy is professor of education at Brooklyn College and specializes in social studies methods, curriculum in elementary and secondary schools, and international education.

One of his primary interests is education for international understanding. Kenworthy has traveled or lived in 22 countries and in 1954 traveled around the world. In 1957-58, he visited nations of Africa, the Middle East and Asia.
