

# Women's Clubs Hold Annual Conference

The conference on Community Development at Home and Abroad sponsored jointly by the Pennsylvania Federation of Womens' Clubs and the University opened Tuesday with over 100 registrants.

The purpose of the conference is to help clubwomen understand their role in world affairs, to promote world understanding through projects and to present ways of developing local discussion groups for adults.

The conference opened with a dinner Tuesday evening for the planning committee and discussion leaders.

The morning session will begin at 9 a.m. today in the Mineral Science auditorium with Dr. Richard Poston, director, Department of Community Development, Southern Illinois University, speaking on community development at home.

At 10:45 a.m., work groups will begin on programs for community development.

At the afternoon session beginning at 2:30 p.m. in the Hetzel Union Building Assembly Room, Dr. Ralph Condee, professor of English literature, will speak on adult education.

Friday's session will focus on community projects abroad. Projects in Mexico and the Philippines will be discussed.

At this session, Mrs. Earle A. Brown, president of the Pennsylvania Federation of Women's Clubs, will be guest speaker.

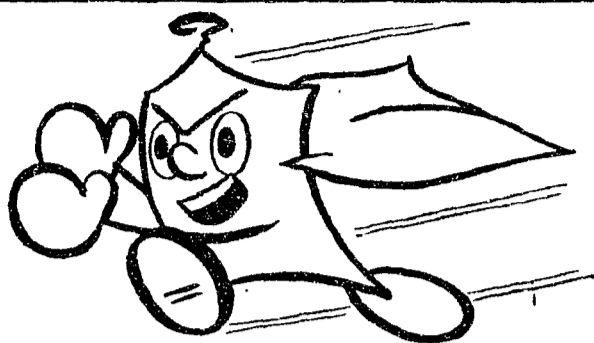

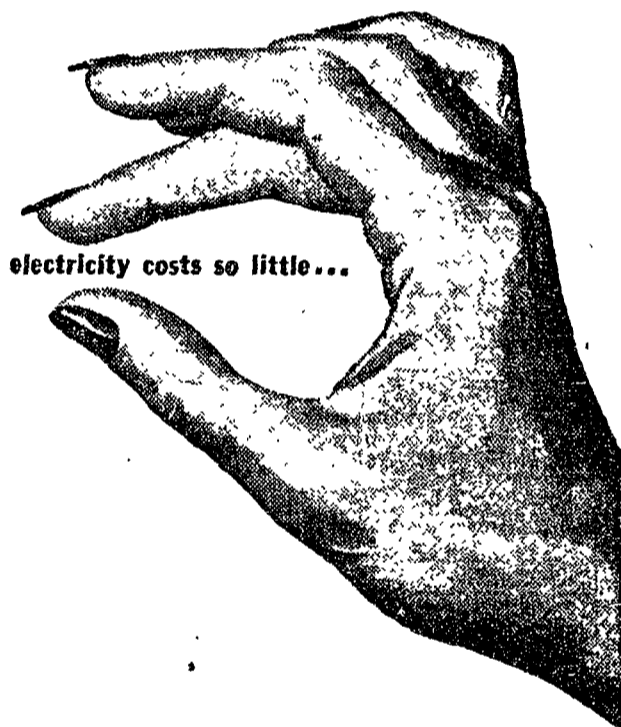
