Friday's session will focus on community projects abroad. Projects in Mexico and the Philippines will be discussed.


At this session, Mrs. Earle A Brown, president of the Pennsyl-vania Federation of Women's Clubs, will be guest speaker.

The annual report of the University, titled, "A Report to the People of the Commonwealth," won first place honors in the publications competition of the Amer-ican College Public Relations Association.


