Mineral display rooms feature various phases and features of ores, and display heavier, more distinctive ores on pedestals. Paintings pertaining to ore in and around Pennsylvania are also displayed, and a modern wood sculpture, "Miners," by Heri Bert Bartscht, is another outstanding work of art
