Red Tape Kills Zeigler Given Old Main Clock New Position

Old Main clock on the campus is the victim of a business change-over, University officials said today.

About three months ago, explains H. L. Yeagley, Jr., director of the department of maintenance and utilities, the company which made the clock sold out its clock business to another firm. The University had previously sent an order to the original manufacturer to come and do a repair job.

Last week a representative of the new owner arrived on campus, but he came only to determine the nature of the trouble and what would be needed to repair the clock.

Nothing has been heard from the company since, although University officials have made repeated requests for action.

Meanwhile, students and area residents who have come to rely on the timepiece have turned to other clocks and watches to keep up with their schedules.

He will also serve as a resource officer for research in the field of student affairs and integrate student affairs research with other areas of research at the University.
