

Rest Home Officers To Hold Conference

Owners, managers, superintendents and other administrative officers of nursing and convalescent homes will attend a 3-day conference beginning Monday.

Over 70 persons are expected to participate in this second annual Nursing and Convalescent Homes Conference.

The College of Home Economics and the Continuing Education Services are conducting the conference under the sponsorship of the Pennsylvania Association of Nursing and Convalescent Homes.

Participants in the conference will study better methods of putting the nursing and convalescent home on a better paying and management basis. They will learn budgeting, financial and cost analysis, food cost controls and food for patient appeal.

The program also includes the study of the role nursing and convalescent homes play in the community and ideas will be exchanged on public relations and ways of operating a home.

Registration will be held Monday morning and the sessions will begin in the afternoon. All sessions will be held in the Mineral Sciences Auditorium.

Speakers at the conference include George T. Mustin, president emeritus of the American Nursing Home Association; Leonard A. Coyle, executive director of the Licensed Nursing Home Association of New Jersey; F. F. Bailey, assistant superintendent of the Lancaster School District; and Frank C. Bateman, executive director of the American Nursing Homes Association.

The concert is open to the public.


U. S. Steel Co. Renews Fellowship in Mining
