

Harshbarger Given Leave Of Absence

Dr. Luther H. Harshbarger, professor of religious studies, University chaplain, and coordinator of religious affairs, will spend a year in England and Europe where he will be engaged in research work dealing with theological and political subjects. He has been granted a leave of absence from August 1 to July 31, 1960. The Penn State chaplain will use Cambridge University, England, as his headquarters. He will be affiliated with Trinity Hall, one of the Cambridge colleges. His research will be on the topic, "Theological Motifs in Relation to the Political Motifs of the Age of Metternich." He plans to specialize in Protestant theological motifs during the period from 1815 to 1848 and will undertake case studies of certain leading theologians in England and Germany. In connection with his research, he will visit several universities in Europe, including Heidelberg. Harshbarger also will visit the so-called "Centers of Renewal" in Europe, including the evangelical academies and the Roman Catholic retreat centers. He also will attend several conferences in England and on the Continent.

Euwema Granted Leave
Dr. Ben Euwema, dean of the College of the Liberal Arts, granted a leave of absence, will spend the next six months traveling through Europe.

The professors make you speak and point out mistakes, he said. One of the pioneers of the institute, James Hahn of Dravosburg, said he was "amazed at the improvement in the classes over the past 14 years." "The institute has now reached the point where the members are not here to be educated by instructors, but to learn to educate themselves."

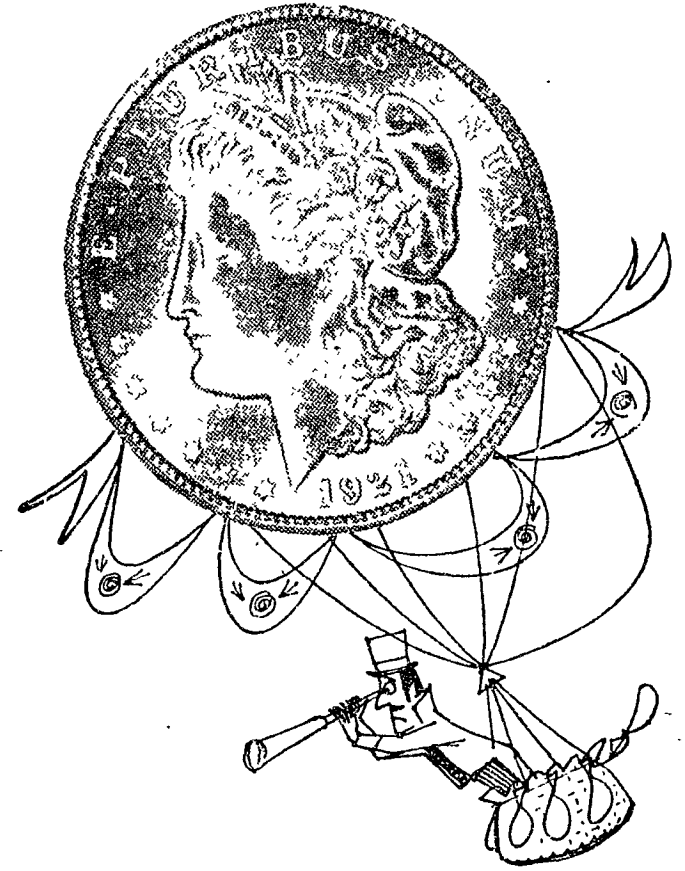
