

Son to Get Doctorate

Gambles to Claim 12th Degree Friday

The Gamble's evidently gamble away their education for a University degree is fast becoming a "must" for the Gamble family.

Mr. and Mrs. Franklin O. Gamble, of RD 1, McDonald, will attend commencement exercises tomorrow night to see their son, Glenn, claim his third degree—a doctorate in education.

Glenn is the youngest of three brothers and the three are graduates of the University and are married to graduates of the University.

The number of degrees in the family now total eleven.

Glenn, who obtained his bachelor's degree in 1951 and his master's degree in 1955, already has accepted a position as director of guidance at the University of Florida Laboratory School, Gainesville, Fla.

Glenn's wife is the former Nancy L. Saylor, of Hagerstown, Md. She qualified for her bachelor of science degree in 1952 and her master of education degree in 1955, both in home economics.

Harvey, oldest of the three brothers and now a crops field man with the Eastern States Farmers' Exchange at Elderton, earned his bachelor of science degree in 1939. His wife, the former Marv Tibbrook, of Irwin, is a 1938 graduate in home economics.

Dean, the middle brother, now with the Cancer-Chemotherapy Service, National Institute of Health, Bethesda, Md., qualified for his bachelor of science degree in agricultural and biological chemistry in 1942, added a master of science degree in 1951, and a doctor of philosophy degree in 1953.

His wife, the former Mary L. Wolff, of Alexandria, gained her bachelor of arts degree from Pennsylvania College for Women but came to the University in 1943 to obtain her master of science degree in agricultural and biological chemistry.

Each of the three boys has three children and this could mean nine more bachelor's degrees, not to mention wives' degrees and advanced degrees.

Waterworks Conference Will Open

About 250 members of the Pennsylvania Waterworks Operators Association will meet on campus Monday through Wednesday for their 33rd annual conference.

The conference is one of the oldest to be held on campus.

Lectures and problem solving sessions will be held in the Mineral Science Auditorium. Discussions will concern labor relations, filtering, chlorination and other problems in the field.

Special lecturers will be Dr. Eugene Myers, associate professor of economics, who will discuss labor-management relations, and Dr. James Gemmell, professor of education, who will speak on his trip to Russia.

Ten of the operators themselves will give formal lectures at the sessions.

Waterworks operators operate and maintain electrical and mechanical equipment such as pumps, settling tanks and chlorinators and perform chemical and bacteriological tests on water to insure its potability.

Patrol Changes Auto Forms

The campus patrol has revised the form used for registration of motor vehicles on campus.

The new form will facilitate the filing of registrations in the office. It consists of one original and four carbons which must be filled out by the applicant. Two copies go to the traffic violations office, two are kept by the patrol and one copy is given to the applicant.

The new forms are also adapted so that filing can be done both numerically and alphabetically. Information requested includes the car license, name of state, name of car and semester. The applicant is also asked if he is physically handicapped, is a commuter or lives in residence halls.
